Every day we all make decisions. Some of these decisions bring changes to our daily routine. According to a Columbian researcher, Sheena Iyengar, the average person makes about 70 decisions every day. That's 25,500 decisions a year. Over 70 years, that's 1,788,500 decisions. The 20th century philosopher Albert Camus said, "Life is a sum of all your choices." You put all of those 1,788,500 choices together, and that's who you are. Decisions, decisions.... Change, change.... Some decisions are easy and the resulting change is obvious for all to see. Some decisions are less easy to make because the resulted changes bring disappointment to those who want things to stay the same.

So how do we know if we have made the right decision, especially one that brings considerable change? expert in this field, but I suspect that all good decisions need something of the following: take a lot of time; combine the efforts of a number of people; give individuals the freedom to dissent; are reached without any pressure from the top to reach an artificial consensus; are based on the participation of those responsible for implementing them; are based upon the ability to look ahead and see what might be ahead; with steadiness, patience, persistence and courage; with prayer, prayer and more prayer, so that God remains central to all decisions and changes.

Still not all decisions are easy to make. The PCC (Parochial Church Council) of this parish has made a decision to change the pattern of Sunday services. It hasn't been an easy decision, but it has been something that has been thought about long and hard over a period of time, involving a number of people. We've also been considering the difficulty we have experienced over the last 18 months to find Church officers and having prayed extensively about this, we felt led by God to seek change.

So in the run up to the APCM (Annual Parochial Church Meeting) when it became clear that we would only have one churchwarden (not for want of asking people) we prayed at "What Now, God?" for God to show us His strategy for the situation we were going to find ourselves in. As we let God speak to us we felt Him clearly saying we need to change in order to work with what we have got by showing us a new pattern of Sunday services. I am only too well aware that people are going to be disappointed, but when we have been struggling to find people to fulfil the roles to help ensure a smooth run on Sundays there comes a point when we have to acknowledge that what has been in the past may no longer work for today.

When we presented the new pattern to the APCM there was an overwhelming positive reaction and the meeting agreed that we should implement the new pattern. We then again discussed this at June's PCC meeting and the vote was unanimous to work with these changes and pilot this for a full year, so we will run from the 1st Sunday of August 2018 through to the last Sunday of July 2019 monitoring the situation as we go.

I do believe that this has been born out of prayer, and so feel that we have to step out in faith. After all, as Christians God calls us to live by faith in Him, and this means that we will have to step out in this faith, even if there is some level of fear and trepidation as we question if we are doing the right thing. We may be wrong, but we will never know if we don't try and trust and believe that this is what God wants

Again in praying for this at a more recent "What Now, God?" we felt that God is calling us to be patient with this change and

to

hold back from making judgements immediately. Therefore, we need to give this a go, particularly since our regular pattern of Sunday services changes from the norm in the autumn with Harvest, All Souls, Remembrance Sunday, and then with our Advent and Christmas services.



JULY Report - Leeann Jackson-Eve (Clerk)

All eight councillors were present. There is a vacancy and we've had some interest in co-option.

Public Forum: County Councillor Jessica Fleming reports that the Cabinet has decided to adopt 'Option 2' for Home-to-School Transport, with some modifications, to be phased in starting in September 2019. The County Council will support transport to a pupil's nearest suitable school (rather than Transport Priority Area school as currently), there will be no requirement to count out of County schools. Support for post-16 education will continue under the new plans. The decision is subject to a callin and review by the County Council Scrutiny Committee which sits on 9th July.

A major review has been launched of the way highways in Suffolk are maintained. This will explore how Suffolk's limited highways budget can be used to best effect for maintaining the county's roads, bridges, grass verges, and other assets. For example, it will look at whether to redirect funds allocated for resurfacing to repair as roads have deteriorated more quickly than anticipated in recent years. A new Highways Improvement and Innovations Board has been established to oversee the areas that will make up the review.

Consultation on Special Needs Education: The public is invited to comment on options for future special educational provision for children and young people between the ages of 5 and 25 at www.suffolk.gov.uk/SENDsufficiencyeducation, by close of business on 7th August. The options propose varying providers from either wholly independent sector, developing new special schools, and/ or specialist centres alongside mainstream schools.

We Are Listening Events: Suffolk residents are invited to come and meet with the Leader of the Council, other county councillors and senior managers about their concerns and ideas for Suffolk. The following are scheduled for the remainder of 2018:

Framlingham: Tuesday 18 September
Bury St Edmunds: Wednesday 26 September

Haverhill: Friday 12 October Ipswich: Thursday 25 October

Planning: The PC considered an application at Common Road for change of use of the land for a commercial fishing lake and addition of a car park. There was no objection to the application. A second application was at Starre House, Chapel Lane for removal of a Leylandii at the bottom of the garden and there was no objection to this either.

Neighbourhood Plan: There have been two Steering Group meetings since the last PC meeting. A representative from

Hastoe Housing Association came to the first one to discuss the potential for affordable housing in the village. Otherwise, the Plan is coming along nicely – we have the budget to see it to completion and it should be ready for public consultation in the autumn.

Dedicated PCSO? The PC has received correspondence from Suffolk Police about parish-funded PCSOs. This might be an opportunity to once again have a regular police presence in the village and has worked well in other parishes, often with several sharing a PCSO to reduce the cost. The PC will be expressing an interest to find out more about the scheme. Tell us what you think!

War Memorial: In advance of November events, the PC has agreed a quote of £2,241 from H L Perfitt for cleaning and letter renovation of the memorial at Botesdale Market Place and £1,455 for deep cleaning the market place paving, both using a conservation system. We will be looking for outside funding for the project.

Overgrown Hedges: Although it isn't recommended to cut hedges between 1 March and 31 August due to nesting birds, please be a good neighbour and trim back any branches that overhang pavements or roads and make it difficult for pedestrians to walk safely or affect road visibility at junctions. Always check first to make sure you won't disturb nesting birds. It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built.

Footpaths and Verges: As always, the cutting doesn't seem to keep up with the growth and SCC makes only a limited number of cuts each year. Please be patient but if a path becomes impassable, let us know or go directly to www.suffolk.gov.uk to report it.

Redgrave July Report - by the Clerk

Councillors Angela Bigley, Mike Denmark, John Giddings, Bob Hayward, Ann Preston and Jason Walker were present in addition to the Clerk and 12 members of the public.

Public Forum: County Councillor Jessica Fleming sent her apologies and a report on Suffolk County Council activities which is summarised in this magazine in the Botesdale report.

A resident spoke in support of the proposed weight restriction on the B1113. This is in the early stages as the PC is pursuing a comprehensive survey by Suffolk County Council of HGV traffic through the village. If the PC can get sufficient evidence of excessive and harmful HGV traffic through Redgrave, it will be much easier to get a Traffic Restriction Order for a weight restriction. If the bid for a weight restriction is successful, it can be policed by a Lorrywatch group. It should be noted that the SCC website estimates that it can take up to 2 years to implement a weight restriction.

Another resident asked about the future of the playing field and Redgrave Amenities Trust representatives assured the meeting that there would be an update soon.

Finally, several residents enquired about grass cutting at the Old School Playing Field. The PC has been unable to cut the grass for several years due to fly-tipped items in the long grass which have damaged machinery in the past. It was suggested that it could be scythed and then walked over to remove the items so that it can be kept cut. If you have the time and ability to undertake this, or you have a better idea, please let us know!

Planning: The planning application at The Grange, Hinderclay Road from last month came back with a slightly altered plan. There were no further comments on it.

Old School Playing Field: The speed survey for Half Moon Lane has been completed and we are just waiting for the final report. The PC has received an abbreviated report which indicates that speeds are generally under the speed limit. The issue of a right of way over the access to the field is being pursued further and legal costs of up to £1,500 have been agreed.

War Memorial: In advance of November events, the PC has

agreed to pay £747 which is a third of the quote of £2,241 from H L Perfitt for cleaning and letter renovation of the memorial at Botesdale Market Place. The memorial is shared with Botesdale and Rickinghall. Outside funding will be sought for the project.

PCSO back on the beat in Redgrave? The PC has received correspondence from Suffolk Police about parishfunded PCSOs. This might be an opportunity to once again have a regular police presence in the village and has worked well in other parishes, often with several sharing a PCSO to reduce the cost. The PC will be expressing an interest to find out more about the scheme with the possibility of sharing with Botesdale and Rickinghall and/or other parishes. Tell us what you think!

Redgrave Shop: The PC has been asked to consider providing £1,500 for a feasibility study looking at how practical it would be to provide a community shop in the pub and has contacted the District Council about grant funding for the project.

Footpaths and Verges: As always, the cutting doesn't seem to keep up with the growth and SCC makes only a limited number of cuts each year. Please be patient but if a path becomes impassable, let us know or go directly to www.suffolk.gov.uk to report it. The PC is trying to arrange additional verge cutting.



Rickinghall Parish Council - Report by Cllr Nick Free

The meeting was opened at 19:30 by the Chairman, receiving apologies from Cllrs Nic Joubert, Sally Smith and Will Maskell. All other Parish Council (PC) members were present, along with the Clerk and our District and County Cllr Jessica Fleming, as well as one member of the Public. The agenda moved swiftly through formalities into the Public Forum.

During her updates, Cllr Fleming reported that the County Council Cabinet had voted on the options presented during the School Transportation Public Consultation. The options were "Option 1 - Bring in Changes September 2019" or "Option 2 - Phase in changes from September 2019" or "Option 3 - Leave as is and find other ways to make savings". The data shows that 3,607 citizens responded to the consultation with more than 90% opposing Option 1, more than 80% opposing Option 2 and more than 85% supporting Option 3. The County Council Cabinet voted for Option 2 with some modifications in that the County Council will support transport to a pupil's nearest suitable school, rather than Transport Priority Area School as currently and, there will be no requirement to count 'out of County' Schools. Jessica went on to explain that the Scrutiny Committee had subsequently 'Called In' the vote made by the Cabinet, in order to review the decisionmaking process. Jessica also reminded the PC that Suffolk County Council is holding "We Are Listening events" where Suffolk residents will have the opportunity to come and meet the leader of the Council. Times are all 11am – 1pm and the dates and general locations are:

- Framlingham: Tuesday 18 September 2018
- Bury St Edmunds: Wednesday 26 September 2018
- Haverhill: Friday 12 October 2018
- Ipswich: Thursday 25 October 2018

Jessica also announced the Public Consultation on Specialist Education where the public is invited to comment on options for future special educational provision for children and young people between the ages of 5 and 25, in Suffolk. The consultation closes 7th August 2018 with details to be found at: www.suffolk.gov.uk/SENDsufficiencyeducation

There was also some discussion within the Public Forum relating to the Coop store, following a rumour that the Coop was relocating to another part of the village but this was not able to be confirmed. It was however noted that the Coop ATM (cash) machine had been restored and was now working, inside the shop in the far corner.

There was one single planning application (an extension) which received no objections, one listed building consent application (barge board replenishment) that was supported and a tree pruning application, also with no objection. There was a single tree planning granted notification from Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC).

Correspondence was discussed, with the information about Parish funded Police Community support officers (PCSOs) and also a Public meeting with the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) in July which the Chairman and Cllr Jones would attend. The PC have expressed an interest in finding out more about the possibility of jointly funding a PCSO with other local villages but this is simply to find out more information at this stage.

There was a Neighbourhood Plan update which outlined that in October 2018 the Plan would be referred to the PC for further input before a

Local Public Consultation was commenced, with a further referral to the PC in January 2019 and then on to MSDC for review.

During correspondence and councillor reports it was noted that a local resident had contacted the PC and requested two new Dog Bins, which was deferred for further investigation by the 'Footpaths Officer' who would report back so an informed decision could be made relating to these specific requests. Another local resident had contacted the PC asking for support relating to improving access to certain footpaths for less mobile residents or those with mobility scooters. This was discussed and resulted in onward discussion with the Suffolk Highways Area Rights of Way Officer, as well as the PC 'Barwoods' representative. Additionally a local resident asked for advice and noted concerns relating to the height, general size and condition of the trees along Hinderclay Road at the front of the Village Hall and the Bungalows there, which has been picked up by the PC 'Tree Warden'.

War Memorial: It was voted upon and carried by a majority that the PC would jointly contribute a portion of the cost to renovate the War Memorial. This was discussed at length as the cost was initially higher than anticipated but was carried on a vote and the PC will contribute to have the remedial work completed. It was discussed around the table that this kind of work is only carried out 'every decade or so'.

In other discussions it was noted that the Silver car that had broken down at the top of Rectory Hill on 4th May, was still parked with two wheels up on the kerb. A number of local residents have now contacted The Police and SCC Highways, and have alerted the PC, but the car is deemed legal and does not meet the definition of abandoned according to the appropriate authorities. So until the owner retrieves the car, please be aware this is a potential 'sight-line' hazard for those accessing / egressing driveways along that stretch, as well as for pedestrians crossing the road; please do take extra care.

During the budget review discussion, three items were raised and questioned by the Chairman, with one being answered and two further being referred back to the Clerk to report back at the next meeting.

The meeting was closed by the Chairman at 20:56.

Mental health services – Have your say!



Barwoods Report for August/ September 2018

Now in the middle of a long heatwave, Northfield Wood looks very dry. The grasses are there and the willow herb and ragwort, but all the



soft tissue plants are brown. The trees look good, however, apart from our most recent planting, the silver birch for Ken Liddle. It went in in April and now needs extra water to help it along.

There is always work to do rescuing the bases of trees from undergrowth that threatens to take all the moisture and nutrients from the ground and, as every year, Low Meadow has a lot of goose grass (cleavers) that drags down whatever it clings to. However, it is looking good, especially now that the paths have been cut.

By contrast, Miller's Orchard is cool, shady and green . Unfortunately, nettles seem to thrive here too but the path is clear.

During the heatwave we are more flexible about when we work on these sites. Early morning or in the evening seem preferable to the heat of the day.



Club News



HERITAGE CIRCLE Sir Thomas Erpingham (1357-1428) – Hero or Thug?

Anne May gave a fascinating account of the life of Sir Thomas Erpingham, a 14th Century knight with strong links to Norwich and Norfolk, at the June meeting of the Heritage Circle at Rickinghall Village Hall. At the start, she posed the question as to whether he was a 'hero' or a 'thuq.'

Thomas was born in 1357. His father, Sir John Erpingham, owned a manor at Erpingham. It is not a surprise that Thomas was sent to the household of the Black Prince, at the age of 11 to begin training for a military career as his father and grandfather had fought at Crécy in 1346. The Black Prince was a powerful patron as he was the eldest son of King Edward III. Thomas served the Black Prince and the House of Lancaster faithfully. In 1370 Thomas inherited the manors of Erpingham and Wicksmere on the death of his father. He gained the reputation of being a brave, loyal soldier. When the Black Prince died in 1376, Thomas transferred his allegiance to the Prince's brother, John of Gaunt. He soon acquired the manor of Gillingham, near Beccles. In the service of John of Gaunt, Thomas 'harried' the Scots and was involved in the sacking of the monasteries at Kelso and Melrose in 1385. He also accompanied his patron on his disastrous attempt to seize the crown of Castile in 1386. As John of Gaunt aged, Thomas began to accompany Henry Bolingbroke, John's son, on military adventures in Europe. This culminated in a visit to Palestine in 1392-3. In 1398 Bolingbroke incurred the displeasure of the King, Richard II, when he arranged to fight a duel with the Duke of Norfolk. The King condemned the possibility of bloodshed and exiled both before the duel could take place. Thomas decided to accompany Bolingbroke in his ten year exile. Within a year, Bolingbroke returned to England, and deposed and imprisoned Richard II. He claimed the throne and was crowned, Henry IV. Sir Thomas Erpingham gained significantly from his loyalty to the new King. He acquired a number of lucrative posts, including Constable of Dover Castle and Warden of the Cinque Ports. Later he became Steward of the Royal Household. Thomas served the King loyally until Henry IV died in 1413. Thomas became very wealthy. He bought a house in Norwich and used his influence to gain a charter for the city which allowed it to have a sheriff and a mayor.

By the time of the accession of Henry V to the throne in 1413, Thomas was about 56 years old, quite elderly for the period, but he remained in royal service and accompanied the King on an expedition to France in 1415. The initial English force of about 11,000 men became depleted by dysentery during the siege of Harfleur. After taking the city, Henry V decided to march to Calais as a gesture of defiance to large French forces which were gathering to his south. The march was very difficult for the starving English army. Eventually, the French forced them into battle at Agincourt. Thomas was the commander of the English archers who inflicted heavy casualties and ultimate defeat on the French. After returning home. Thomas retired and focussed his attention upon Norwich and Norfolk. He contributed to the rebuilding of St Andrew's Hall which had been destroyed by fire in 1413. His coat of arms is displayed on the church. In 1420 he initiated the building of the Erpingham Gate, and entrance to Norwich Cathedral. This bears the only known image of Thomas, a kneeling statue high on the gate, although this is thought to have been added in the 18th Century. He died in 1428 and is buried in Norwich Cathedral near the altar. He left money to endow a number of Norfolk churches.

Anne concluded her talk by considering her initial question of hero or thug. Our concept of 'knight' is largely a Victorian creation of a brave, just, loyal and generous person. In reality, knights were probably violent people intent on accumulating honour and wealth. Thomas appears just to have been a man of his time.

The next meeting of the Heritage Circle will be at 7.30pm on Wednesday 22 August at The Village Hall, Rickinghall. 

Memories of The Cross Keys Part 3

The Cross Keys hit the headlines in October 2001 when the former owner of the pub was fatally stabbed at her mother's home in Chadwell Heath, Essex. Marilyn Garside, aged 54, had gone to visit her mother and went to answer the front door as her mother was wheel chair bound. A man was standing on the doorstep who then proceeded to stab her. Marilyn's mother, Barbara Rawle, heard her daughter cry out "no, no, no" and went to the door to find her lying in a pool of blood. She raised the alarm but Marilyn died an hour after arriving at St. Georges Hospital, Ilford. At first no motive could be found but the following March the police featured the murder on the BBC Crimewatch programme and appealed for information. As a result of this information the following September Marilyn's husband James and Richard Bates were arrested.

The six-week trial revealed much about the Garside's life at the pub with evidence coming from regulars and staff at the Cross keys. Marilyn and James met in 1990. Marilyn, a divorced mother of two, owned her own house from a previous marriage and was paid £100,000 after being made redundant from an engineering firm in 1996. (1).

They bought The Cross Keys in June 1997 and married two months later. The couple kept the pub for four years during which time James had several affairs and resorted to violence at least twice. During this time James often said he would kill or arrange to have Marilyn killed to inherit her money. Marilyn (known as Lyn) was popular with the regulars but James was not and some customers stopped coming to

the pub because of him. The pub was sold in June 2001 for £250,00 and the couple moved to Romford, Essex together but shortly after became estranged and James moved to the King's Lynn area to live with his current girlfriend. He met up with Richard Bates and paid him £4,000 for a contract killing. Evidence proved that Richard's DNA was found on the gate of the house and more evidence came from mobile phone calls between the two men around the time of the murder, one call by James establishing where Marilyn was as the time of the murder. Both men were sentenced to jail for life in June 2003.


George and Angie Estcourt purchased The Cross Keys from the Garsides. When they heard of Marilyn's murder they organised a collection from the village to send flowers for the funeral and the money left over was given to Quidenham Children's Hospice. Marilyn had been trustee of a fund to support Connor Bartlett, an eight-year old boy from Redgrave, who suffered from acute myeloid leukaemia and a brain disorder and was often a resident in the hospice.

As well as the vast array of local history information available to browse, there will be two illustrated talks. Gwyn Thomas, the former Curator of the Suffolk Regiment Museum, will speak on "The Suffolk Regiment in the Great War". This will be followed by Sarah Doig's talk on "War on the Home Front". These talks will take place in the morning at 10.30am and 11.00am, repeated in the afternoon at 2.30pm and 3.00pm. There will be plenty of time in between to look at the displays and to talk to members of the Quatrefoil team.

Quatrefoil now have an impressive array of fourteen local history books they have published on various subjects. The whole collection will be available for sale at the event. These include war-related books: "James Scarfe of Botesdale: One of the Noble Six Hundred" which tells the story of a local resident who fought in, and survived, the Charge of the Light Brigade during the Crimean War, "Lest We Forget: Botesdale, Redgrave and Rickinghall Men of the Great War" and "Villages in Wartime: Life in Botesdale, Redgrave and Rickinghall in World War Two".

Nyall's Notes

I have written some 'Christian fiction' and observed that it is often possible to produce a clearer explanation by setting up a conversation between two parties. It certainly enables one to ask questions of oneself. This conversation is between myself and Kim who asked how one knows God's forgiveness.

I started, "You have twin sisters. One finds a man and they get married. In a fit of drunken jealousy the other shoots him at the wedding and, we will set the example in America, ends up on death row. That one on death row can't believe her sister has forgiven her. The day before the execution that sister visits her in jail and at the end of visiting time, pushes her out saying that she will con the warders for a while. Next day she is executed in place of the guilty sister. Could there be a clearer way of demonstrating forgiveness?"

"No, presuming she knew what was going to happen, I have to agree with that one," Kim replied.

"Jesus manoeuvred himself into that position for you." Kim asked, "Can you explain that a bit more?"

I drew a sequence of pictures. On the left I drew a stick man standing. "That's Jesus before he was crucified." On the right I drew one lying down. "That's you. The Bible says 'dead in sins." I drew a big burden on the back of the one lying down. "There you are all the wrongs you ever did."

Under the left, the Jesus column, I drew a cross and put a stick man on it. On the right I drew the one lying down and then drawing the burden of sins I put it on the one on the cross.

"That's not fair," said Kim.

"I didn't say it was fair. It wasn't fair on the innocent sister but she herself manoeuvred it that way. Jesus did the same thing. The Bible says that he bore our wrongs on the cross. I have to draw it that way."

"I see," said Kim thoughtfully.

"Let me go on because the story isn't over yet. When Jesus died he paid for that big burden of sins. He didn't have any of his own to pay for. He paid for yours and he paid in full so when I draw my next two pictures I will draw Jesus dead in the tomb with the burden gone as it has been paid for in full. I will draw you exactly as you were: dead but the wrongs having been taken by Jesus." I drew two stick men lying down.

"Now this is important, both pictures are exactly the same. Jesus has manoeuvred himself and you so that they are exactly the same. Now God in heaven says, 'My son has paid the price but not for himself. I am pleased with him. I will raise him to life.' But he has to be absolutely fair. That is his nature, unfairness is wrong and you and Jesus are in the same position so he has to raise you to life with him. The Bible says that, 'We are raised with him,' or 'As God the Father raised Jesus so too he gives us new life."

"That's brilliant," observed Kim.

"It means that I might say sorry to God for what I have done wrong and not know the forgiveness but the cross of Jesus tells me I am forgiven."

"Mmm," said Kim thoughtfully, "But I don't feel dead."

"But would you say that you are alive to God."

"Then you are dead to God. You might say spiritually dead."

Bill's Birds

Just south of Norwich there is a large lake, Whitlingham Great Broad. It has an excellent centre with parking, food, etc, even wheelchairs with enormous balloon-like wheels to iron out the bumps on its excellent circular

As usual, in these summer days, there are plenty of lake and land birds. Also, some very loud screaming Swifts. Excessively loud and there, above the parking place, was a pole with a square top containing several holes man-made Swift nests and the screams we heard were recordings of Swifts attracting these birds, hopefully to use these man-made nests!

The last time I heard and saw such attractions was on the island of Malta. There, in a large enclosure, were several man-made and used comfortable little rooms open at one end to the skies

and built to accommodate 'shooters'. The recordings of birds were being targeted at our passing-through migratory birds to breed in Europe and luring such birds into the range of these 'brave' shooters. What a contrast?

Now back to Suffolk I have again visited (this time in better weather), Minsmere. What a welcome noise in the 'scrape' from nesting gulls, resident Avocets and visiting waders. One new gull I noticed was a Mediterranean Gull with a real black head. It has now joined our black (dark brown) headed gulls in their nesting site. It is a big gull with a red bill and legs.

Coincidentally I have visited Lackford Lakes near Bury St Edmunds and saw three small gulls flying in circles like terns and surface feeding. These were immature Little Gulls passing through East Anglian waters. If they were adults they would remain 'small' but they would also have the same black heads and red feet as the Mediterranean Gull. Lackford Lakes has an excellent 'centre' from which one can watch birds on their nearby feeders. On that day a Greater Spotted Woodpecker and Marsh Tit. On their pond swam a pair of Gadwalls. Not a very exciting looking grey duck with marked white wing feathers at its side. The female has the same white marking as the male, but typically, being female, is much smaller. In the past I have seen a Water Rail on this site happily pinching food meant for pheasants. The Water Rail is a bird rarely seen and with a hideous pig-like cry. Sadly the Lakes' two male Nightingales had found mates and had ceased to sing.

And now Turtle Doves. One was seen in a garden in Hinderclay. Once only. It was probably searching in vain for successful nesting sites of the past, but then moving on. But, surprise, surprise, a pair has nested in our area. This really is exciting news. The Turtle Dove's population since 1994 has fallen by nearly 93%, mainly due to our new farming methods, but not helped by the aforementioned Maltese 'shooters' slaying them on their migratory routes. I wish I had been able to hear their 'purring' song. It used to be typical of the English summer.

Two more churchyards have been home to Spotted Flycatchers and one annual visitor to Redgrave has successfully fledged young.

I have previously mentioned that we have Oyster Catchers nesting near Redgrave Lake. These are waders, black and white, with red bills and legs. These coastal birds are being seen much more frequently inland. When heard flying overhead they have a distinctive 'peeping' cry which you will never forget. A pair have recently been seen on Rickinghall playing field.

I write while Swifts are screaming over our home in this hot summer, against a long-lasting background of a clear blue sky. They may have gone by the time you read this month's magazine. Happy holidays and don't forget your binoculars.



Commemoration of Suffolk Great War soldier's burial sites

On this the centenary of the end of the Great War an event is being organised to recognise and pay homage to those whose death was attributable to their service in the First World War and who are buried in Suffolk under the auspices of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.

The intention is that on the 8th of November groups of local schoolchildren will assemble at the location of the graves and will be told about the connections the soldier had with their community, his service history and the importance of remembering the sacrifice he and others made. Then at 11am, throughout the County, representatives of those same children will lay poppy crosses on each grave followed by a minute silence.

Each RBL Branch in the County are responsible for the graves in their area. Stanton branch have 10 graves in five different locations. They are as follows:

Bread Pudding

Ingredients

- 8oz. Bread
- Generous 6oz dried fruit use equal amounts of currants, raisins, sultanas
- · 2oz brown sugar
- 2oz suet
- half a teaspoon each of ground cinnamon, ginger, mixed spice, cloves. (Maybe a little less ground cloves as they are quite pungent)
- a good sprinkle of grated nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon (heaped if you can) dark rum
- 1 egg
- milk
- cold tea.

Method:

Break bread up and soak in cold tea 5-10 mins
Strain and squeeze (the bread that is!)
Put into a basin and beat with a fork to break up
Add all dry ingredients and mix well
Add rum and egg, mix and add milk to make fairly sloppy
Put into greased tin in oven at gas 4 (180C) for about 1
hour to 1 hour 30 mins until it appears done.
