

All Souls - A time to remember your loved ones



I am sure that you will appreciate that this year we can't have a service for All Souls Day as we have had in previous years. But as your local church we don't want to forget those who have experienced bereavement so we plan to do something different. On Sunday 1st November I will be in St Mary's Church, Rickinghall at 3pm to light a candle and then read out the names of those who have died over the past year. If you would like me to include the name of a loved one you wish to remember, please do get in touch with me via the contact details above. Rickinghall Church will be open on Saturday 31st October from 9.30am – 3.30pm for those who would like a time of private prayer. It will also be possible to add the name of the person you wish to be remembered on the 1st November to a list in church. (For Covid-19 reason please bring your own pen, use the hand sanitiser as you enter the building, and wear a face mask).

Why do we light candles on such an occasion? There are at least three reasons for doing so, and they are,

Lighting a candle is a prayer:

When we have gone it stays alight, kindling in the hearts and minds of others the prayers we have already offered for them.

Lighting a candle is a parable:

Burning itself out it gives light to others. Christ gave himself for others. He calls us to give ourselves.

Lighting a candle is a symbol:

Of love and hope, of light and warmth. Our world needs them all.

As I light the candle I will say these words:

We remember before God those whom we love and light a candle to symbolise the light of Christ which eternally shines and brings hope. Jesus said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.'

You O Lord are our lamp You turn our darkness into light With you O Lord is the well of life In your light shall we see light Jesus Christ is the light of the world A light no darkness can quench

Then I will speak out the names of those who have requested me to do so, and close with prayers of remembrance for all who have died, their families and friends.

I would also like to invite you, if it is convenient for you, to pause and be quiet, reflect and pray in the comfort of your own home on Sunday 1st November 2020 at 3pm when I am in church. Perhaps you could light a candle in your own home at 3pm as you remember those you love who have died. You may want to say the words above that I will use at 3pm. If this date and or time are not convenient then please do feel free to find an alternative time to be quiet, reflect and pray that suits your daily routine.

Please find below a prayer that you could use as you pause and reflect on the life of the person/people you are remembering.

Dear God, thank you for and for all they meant to me and to others. Help me to know that you are here with me now, holding all my hopes, holding all I love, and holding me this day. Thank you that your presence helps to ease the pain of my sorrow and loss. Thank you that your peace and hope are surrounding and comforting me now. In Jesus name. Amen.

You could also pray these words over the next few days that follow. Alternatively, you may wish to say your own prayers. Whatever you do be assured God will hear your prayers. You may also like to light a candle online at www.churchofengland.org/funeral-candle

Friends of St Mary's Rickinghall Inferior

The final evaluation of Historic England's Taylor Review Pilot Scheme for churches was published on Saturday 3rd October. This was a trial only tested in Suffolk as a rural area and Greater Manchester as an urban society. The grant was only available for listed churches and Rickinghall Inferior Church received seven and a half thousand pounds towards repairs needed at the church. Historic England organised publicity in the media and Rickinghall Inferior Church was chosen as a good example for Suffolk and appeared on Look East and Radio Suffolk and in the East Anglian Daily Times.

The whole point of the minor grant scheme was to encourage maintenance of the church building to help to prevent major repairs. The money was used on Rickinghall Inferor Church to replace deteriorating asbestos gutters and build new gullies to take rainwater away from the damp walls. Other roofing repairs were carried out excluding the north slope of the chancel roof which has to be completely retiled and a new ceiling put into the chancel. This is estimated to be in the region of sixty to seventy thousand pounds, for which we have to raise about half of the money as match funding for most of the bigger grants.

Although many of our fund raising events planned for this year have had to be postponed until next year due to covid 19, volunteers have carried out churchyard maintenance, cut hedges and put up new notice boards for which we are extremely grateful and would like to thank them. Plans are in hand to have water laid on at the church to eventually have a kitchen and toilet after the main repairs to the chancel roof have been carried out.

As well as giving the grant Historic England employed two officers to advise on maintenance of the building and other community advice including setting up a Friends group. We did not get enough people to start a formal group with chairman, treasurer and secretary we had help to start an informal Friends group with a memorandum of understanding with the PCC with Jackie Arnold as representative to the PCC.





Website and E-Consultation

Patients may have noticed that there is a new Botesdale Health Centre Website.

Patients can now complete an E-consultation form on the website and Patients are being encouraged to use this facility. You can use the form to request an appointment with a Doctor or to receive a vaccination. Your requirements will be triaged and a Doctor or appropriate person will advise you of the next steps to be taken either by yourself or your GP.

For Patients who are not so comfortable with technology, they can still continue to phone into the Practice as usual.

Social Prescriber

We have a new Social Prescriber, Jo Burnett, at Botesdale Surgery. If a Doctor considers Jo's service will assist you, then, as a Patient of the practice you can be referred.

The Suffolk Resilience Forum

The Patient Participation Group (PPG) of Botesdale Health Centre would like to notify Patients that the Suffolk Resilience Forum has launched a new support line to help people across Suffolk access information or support relating to debt, benefits, housing or employment.

This support service is in response to the financial impact that Covid-19 has had and continues to have on families across Suffolk.

Citizens Advice Suffolk Alliance, and Anglia Care Trust and Ipswich Housing Action Group will deliver advice and support to people through a single phone line - 0800 068 3131 is open 9-5 pm Mon-Fri.

The service is non-judgemental, impartial and knowledgeable about what is available to enable people to make the right decision.

The phone line is just one element of the Suffolk Advice and Support Service which pulls together work of the Local Welfare Assistance Scheme, which can assist with food vouchers and furniture donations. Trained advisers are waiting to hear from people hit by the side effects of Covid 19. This service has been devised and delivered in a matter of weeks Mathew Hicks, Leader of Suffolk County Council has stated, and is a true partnership of Agencies.

Experts say that a very dry spring, and a 'classic' summer gave most trees a good chance of keeping their leaves on until the colour started to develop as temperatures dropped.

Fieldfares and Redwings should be arriving and you may see them in your gardens especially if you have berried shrubs or hedges. They will strip them and move on to the next source of food. The hedgehogs in our garden were active into late October, so if you're planning a bonfire on the fifth, check first that you're not putting them

I said in the October issue that the Creative Fen Group were planning an art exhibition at The Fox in Garboldisham in November. Sadly, this has had to be postponed, but will hopefully happen in May 2021.

November is also the month when we usually hold our AGM-(remember the record turn out last year!). 

It seems as though each time there is some light at the end of the tunnel, someone makes the tunnel a bit longer! We <u>will</u> get there and we really look forward to welcoming back all our usual visitors. In the meantime, we hope

that you are all safe and well and coping with the current restrictions.

As well as running Coffee on the Corner every month, many of you will be familiar with the additional event, in the form of a Macmillan Coffee Morning, usually held on the third Friday of September. Well, this too was "put on hold" as it is unclear whether the "Rule of 6" applies to Coffee Mornings in the local Chapel hall.

However, you will be aware that all charities are now desperately short of funds and, if not now, then in the future, services will have to be pruned as the funds to support them will simply not be there. So what could we do?

I decided that I could do something, albeit smaller than usual and so, at the last minute (with only about 5 days to go) I contacted around 40 local people and invited them to come to my home ... not all at once, I might add! I invited small groups of 3 or 4 to come for an hour each to enjoy coffee/tea and cake, to purchase some delicious home produce, to browse a second hand book stall and to purchase Charity Christmas Cards and everyday greetings cards. As with Coffee on the Corner, I was amazed at the generosity of people - some donated cakes, others garden produce and the lovely Carol made scones (two varieties!) and lemon curd. There was plenty of hand sanitiser (particularly over used by me!) as tea and coffee and cakes were served and as much distance as possible was maintained between guests. Any produce leftover was hawked around my lovely neighbours on Saturday morning in the rain.

Much to my absolute amazement, we raised an incredible £410 and, although the day was somewhat different to usual events, I think (and hope) that everyone enjoyed the experience and, just as importantly, felt safe in the situation.

This was not what I had hoped to do for Macmillan, but it was something and I cannot thank my helpers, bakers, makers, producers and visitors enough for this result!

I SO hope that we can return to more normal times before too long.

Restrictions permitting, I hope to hold a similar event at the end of November (maybe with mince pies and mulled wine?!) and, if you know me, or are a regular visitor to Coffee on the Corner, and would like to be on the "guest list", do please get in touch and I shall try to organise a "safe", distanced, sanitised event to invite folks to that bit nearer to Christmas.



Report of October Botesdale PC Meeting—by the Clerk

Four councillors attended this meeting on Zoom, with apologies from Ernie Baxter. Our District/County Councillor Jessica Fleming was also in attendance and there were no members of the public.

Cllr Fleming reported that a new COVID support phoneline for general assistance has been set up as of 1st October to help access information or support relating to debt, benefits, housing or employment. The phoneline, 0800 068 3131, is open from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday. Suffolk Public Health has set up a dedicated web site at www.healthysuffolk.org.uk/jsna/coronawatch

School Year 2021 primary and secondary school applications open - Parents and carers can now apply for primary and secondary school places for September 2021. The deadline for applications for secondary school is Saturday 31 October 2020 and for primary schools it is Friday 15 January 2021. Parents and carers should apply for a school place online at suffolk.gov.uk/admissions

Visitors to Mid Suffolk's car parks can now use digital payment system MiPermit, as well as a cash payment option. The Council is also looking at future contactless payment options.

Planning: The PC had no objection to an application at 6 The Fairstead for works to trees.

Correspondence: The PC noted correspondence consulting on the Redgrave Neighbourhood Plan and draft recommendations from the Boundary Commission on new divisions, division boundaries and division names for Suffolk County Council. The latter will have little effect on our area.

An offer has been received from Mid Suffolk District Council to plant trees and hedgerows on PC-owned land to improve wildlife corridors and the PC will express an interest while giving some thought to a location which might benefit. We've also had correspondence about Quiet Lanes and will be looking into this for Mill Road North. A Quiet Lane is a nationally recognised designation of single-track low usage road suitable for walking, cycling and horses with limited access for motorised vehicles.

Finally, there was a complaint about littering at the Recreation Ground. The PC thanks everyone who regularly collects rubbish at the Ground – this is much appreciated. The Ground is very well used in good weather and unfortunately not everyone who uses it treats it respectfully. We have spoken to the Police about this and they have in turn spoken to users of the Ground as have some of our councillors. We will continue to try to find a solution to this problem.

Remembrance Day: We are sad to say that the annual Remembrance Day event has been cancelled due to the ongoing Covid pandemic. The Chapel of Ease can't be used as it only has one entry/exit point and is not able to separate out people whilst maintaining social distance. A service at the memorial would also suffer from the same difficulties of social distancing as numbers cannot be controlled. People are encouraged to commemorate the event in their own way, but we would discourage everyone from attending en masse at any point.

Christmas Events: Reluctantly, the PC has also made the decision not !

to hold collective Christmas events this year, including the Lights On event and Father Christmas, due to the same issues. We will be erecting a tree of course as we all need a bit of festivity in 2020 and the usual lovely artwork from the school will be around the tree.

Recreation Ground: In early 2019 Botesdale Parish Council recognised that much of the current equipment in the Recreation Ground in Mill Road was nearing the end of its useable life and therefore consideration needed to be given as to what would follow. The Parish Council engaged Groundworks, a leading communities and environmental charity, to undertake an initial feasibility study. As part of that study Groundworks undertook a local survey to establish what the community wanted from the future Recreation Ground.

Based on the initial study and the survey, the Parish Council established a Sub Committee to drive the Recreation Ground Regeneration Project forward. The Sub Committee includes representatives covering the broad demographic of Botesdale.

Since late 2019 the Sub Committee have been working hard to establish a development path for the Recreation Ground. A detailed Project Brief was prepared, and this ensured that the future Recreation Ground would provide facilities for the whole community.

The Project Brief formed the foundation for an extensive tendering exercise to select a design organisation to develop the project. A local company, James Blake Associates (JBA) based in Bury St Edmunds, have been awarded the contract to prepare the design for the regenerated Recreation Ground. The Sub Committee have established with JBA a project programme that will see the design completed by the early summer of next year with a view to the construction works taking place in the following winter such that the regenerated Recreation Ground will open in the spring of 2022.

During the design phase there will be planned consultations with the community regarding the nature and extent of the regeneration. There will also be a significant effort over the next 9 months to raise the necessary funds for the construction works.

Report of October PC Meeting by the Clerk

Four councillors attended this meeting on Zoom, with apologies from John Giddings and Frank Gillett. There were no members of the public.

The Parish Council accepted a letter of resignation from Bob Hayward. He has given decades as a parish councillor and has now decided to retire from the post. Bob has a wealth of knowledge about Redgrave and its activities and his input will be sorely missed. He leaves with the Council's heartfelt thanks for everything he has done for the community.

Planning: There were no new planning applications but it was noted that the application for parking on the field south of the Redgrave Business Centre has been withdrawn.

Neighbourhood Plan: The public consultation on the draft Plan began on 14th September 2020 and will end at midnight on 8th November 2020. There are copies of the Plan available in the Shop for you to borrow for a little light reading and instructions on how to comment on the Plan. Please make sure you get your comments in on time!

Redgrave Shop: We're very pleased to say that the Shop's status as an Asset of Community Value has been approved by Mid Suffolk District Council for another five years.

Council Documents: The PC's Standing Orders, Financial Regulations and Risk Assessment documents have all been reviewed and updated where necessary.

Correspondence: The PC noted correspondence consulting draft recommendations from the Boundary Commission on new divisions, division boundaries and division names for Suffolk County Council. The latter will have little effect on our area.

An offer has been received from Mid Suffolk District Council to plant trees and hedgerows on PC-owned land to improve wildlife corridors and the PC will express an interest while giving some thought to a location which might benefit. We've also had correspondence about Quiet Lanes and will be looking into this for Fen Street. A Quiet Lane is a nationally recognised designation of single-track low usage road suitable for walking, cycling and horses with limited access for motorised vehicles.

Play Area: The annual inspection has been concluded, thankfully with only minor issues to consider. The Chairman has kindly agreed to put a new backboard on the basketball goal.

Christmas Tree: The Chairman is going to be organising the tree again this year. Any offers of help are welcome!

Remembrance Day: We are sad to say that the annual Remembrance Day commemorative event has been cancelled due to the ongoing Covid pandemic. Unfortunately, it is in the interest of public safety to discourage a large gathering as is usual for this event. We urge everyone to commemorate this event by standing on your doorstep at 11:00, both on Remembrance Sunday (8th) and November 11th and observing a two-minute silence, broken with clapping at its conclusion. We also urge those who wish to place wreaths or markers to do so before the 8th. If you do choose to pay your respects at the Memorial, please do so in a socially distanced manner and respect others' privacy.

Report of October PC Meeting by Cllr Geoff Short

Our October meeting took place on Zoom, with apologies from one councillor, and five members of the public joined us. The public forum provided an opportunity for two parties to put their views on a Planning Application for a single house to be built on vacant land in The Street. The councillors felt it would be a suitable property for the plot, had off road parking, and had no objection. Similarly, there was no objection to the erection of one property in West Hall Road on the same footprint as the existing house.

There were two applications for tree felling and reduction in Water Lane, and again there were no objections. Tree works seem to feature each month at the moment, and it is to be expected with some of the properties being built close to existing trees.

Another planning matter arose concerning the flue on the roof of the proposed pizza shop, next to The Bell, where it would appear that the positioning differed from that submitted to Planning, and the council have drawn this to the attention of MSDC. We await an inspection and response.

We have had various complaints by people over the last few months about the overgrown state of the footpaths and wrote to Suffolk County Council enquiring why they had not been cut. It appears that nine paths were removed from the cutting schedule, without notification. Apparently, the network of paths in the county is the same size as the road network, and the budget is only £200,000. So, they say with 5600 kilometres of path, there is not enough money to cut the network once. So now we know!

Plans are continuing to install a defibrillator in the old BT phone box near the marketplace. We now have grants of £2500 towards the project, and the box should be refurbished soon.

As the year draws to an end, we will provide a wreath for the war memorial on Remembrance Sunday, but there will be no ceremony this year due to the virus. Similarly, the two parishes will be going ahead with the usual large Christmas tree in the Market Place, but there will be no activities or Father Christmas in attendance. The Village Hall also advised there would be no

fireworks display this year. All a great shame, and this current 'normal' was totally unheard of this time last year - who could have predicted what a disastrous year 2020 would become?

Various documents were approved, the bills approved for payment, and correspondence noted. Redgrave are getting on well with their Neighbourhood plan, which has now gone to public consultation, and we will shortly be setting up an Infrastructure Steering Group as a result of the Botesdale and Rickinghall Plan to work on some of the policies raised.

We were asked to consider whether we had any council owned land where trees or hedges could be planted. There is a campaign at the moment to improve wildlife corridors, and there are also supplies of disease resistant elms. We have parcels of land that have sufficient trees, and don't have any large verges or greens. From the foregoing, we obviously don't wish to plant any trees too near properties (creating overgrown tree problems for the future) or plant hedges too near footpaths (where clearly they would never get cut) so if anybody has a brilliant suggestion, do let the clerk know!

As always, I would mention that there are vacancies on the Council if you would like to consider joining us. You are very welcome to contact the clerk or a councillor to chat about what it entails, should you wish to know more.

RICKINGHALL SKATE PARK UPDATE

Detailed plans have been developed during the past year for a complete redesign and replacement of the existing Rickinghall Skate Park. Village Hall committee volunteers, helped by outside enthusiasts, have put a lot of work in on this, including planning with potential suppliers, and also in the demanding process of applying for grant funding from multiple sources.

One of the major funders was to be Sport England, which was supportive of the project in principle but had one additional specific requirement: that the facility be floodlit every night to create 'more impact'. There was no flexibility on this requirement, and since floodlighting is not a desirable option in this location the redesigned facility will not now go ahead.

Quite apart from the fact that planning permission would have had to be sought for such major floodlighting, besides the requirement to go out to tender AND to find the extra money required, enquiries made of other locations where skate park floodlighting was installed suggested very negative outcomes for the local communities concerned. Such floodlit facilities seem to attract all sorts of people from beyond their local areas, and the lights end up being taken out of use or even removed.

It doesn't seem like a good idea to continue with a project which would probably not only cause problems for the Village Hall's neighbours, but also for the wider village community, thus the decision to abandon it.

We now hope instead to replace the time-expired quarter pipe with a similar new one. This will mean that local youngsters will be able to continue with their many uses of the existing facility, including riding small-wheeled scooters and BMX bikes, just running up and down the ramps, and even actual skate boarding!

So a shame, especially given all the wasted time, but going forward we will still have a facility which continues to be ever-popular amongst our local children, both young and old.



Exploring the Past

Rickinghall Inferior Church East Window and Chancel
The Taylor Review Pilot scheme has just published its final review
of the scheme trialled in Suffolk and Manchester. One of the
conditions of being awarded a grant was to maintain the church
building for the next five years.

One of the jobs in hand at Rickinghall is renewing the metal guards for protecting the stained glass of the east window of the chancel. This window is important in the history of the church as it was installed in memory of the Rev Richard Compton Maul's daughter. Beneath the window internally is a narrow strip of brass with the following inscription: To the glory of God and the memory of Sophie his dear wife. George Badeley-Marke Esq of Wood Hill Liskeard Cornwall affectionately dedicates this window. She was the eldest daughter of the Rev. R.C. Maul Rector of this parish and lies asleep beneath the snows of Mont Blanc where she accidentally met her death August 2nd 1870 aged 22 years. George and Sophie had been married in Rickinghall Superior church the month before. The couple travelled to Switzerland and the day before her death, arrived at their hotel in good weather, with a friend of Sophie and two guides. The following morning they left the hotel at 3.30 am with an extra guide to climb Mont Blanc. By 10 am the weather had turned very windy so George went ahead with two of the guides to see if it was safe to continue and told the two women to stay with the remaining guide and said he would be back in about 15 minutes and told them to stay where they were. The guide accompanying the ladies decided it would be best to go back, so they set off down the mountain with the three of them tied to one another and Sophie holding on to the guide's arm with her friend behind them. Suddenly the guide and Sophie fell into a crevasse covered by snow. Fortunately for the friend the rotten rope broke and she was left standing on the ledge terrified. George heard her cries and rushed back and shouted into the chasm but there was no answer. The bodies were never recovered although they were searched for and their deaths are not recorded.

A funeral service was held in the English chapel in Chamonix a week later. George not only replaced the glass of the East window of Rickinghall Inferior Church he replaced the whole of the stone tracery. The previous window, shown in 'Parish Churches' published in 1848 and drawn by R. and J.A. Brandon is completely different. Beneath the window is

another memorial to
Sophie. This has been
made from parts of the rood
screen which the historian,
Rev Edmund Farrer dated
to circa 1430. This would
have been removed at the

reformation but was found in with some old pews. The panels have been painted but the carving has been left unpainted. Beneath the panels is written "In memory of Sophie Marke August Ilnd MDCCCLXX." (August 2nd 1870).

This was not the only tragedy to hit the rector's family. His son, Richard Compton French Maul, was a lieutenant with the 3rd (East Kent) Regiment of Foot, The Buffs. He was sent to India but was invalided out of India in 1874 and was returning to England where he died on the journey on the 25th April, less than four years after the death of his sister. His father wrote next to his entry in the burial register "died at Southampton on his way home from India." In Rickinghall Church yard is a tall memorial which many people take to be a first world war memorial but this was presented by Richard's fellow officers in The Buffs. On the base facing east it reads "To the glory of God and to the memory of Richard Compton French Maul late Lieutenant 3rd Reg The Buffs. His brother officers affectionately dedicated this cross July 1875." The west side says "R.C.F.M. Died April 25th 1874 aged 27 years. Veteri Frondecit Honore". Translated this means "Its Ancient Honour Flourishes. Its Ancient Honour is Ever-Green" which is the Motto of the 3rd (East Kent) Regiment of Foot ("The Buffs"). Unfortunately, the cross has disappeared from the top of the memorial but old postcards exist showing the cross on top. Rev Richard Maul did a lot of good work for the parishes of Rickinghall Inferior and Superior. The livings were purchased for him by his elder brother John in 1850. At this time the rectory. situated in Hinderclay Road, was described as a cottage, but Richard enlarged it at the front, making it look much grander. He had 3 children by this time, and had three more children whilst living in Rickinghall. At the bottom of the wall of the Victorian extension are bricks marked with RCM 1850 and RCFM his

He gave part of his glebe land adjoining Rickinghall Inferior churchyard, on which Rickinghall school was built and opened in 1853.

The Rector's younger brother, Rector of Drinkstone, died aged only 35 in 1861 and he is buried in the churchyard just south of the chancel.

Rectors of churches were financially responsible for the upkeep of the chancel before 1923 and the parishioners responsible for the upkeep of the remainder of the church. Rev Maul employed the architect J.D. Wyatt to draw up plans for major restoration of the church in the late 1850s. The medieval stone piscina to the right of the altar was restored and new Minton floor tiles laid in the Sanctuary, with black and red tiles laid in the rest of the chancel. Silk was bought for an altar cloth which may have been the Victorian frontal used for the altar until recently. His total expenditure on the chancel was £222.18.4d.

Rev. Richard Maul died on the 4th October 1888 aged 67 and was buried next to his brother in the churchyard to the south of the chancel. There is a memorial window dedicated to him in the south wall of the chancel given by his widow. I feel the chancel owes much of its appearance to this man and his family.

Exploring the Past Again

The Bypass and Main Road through Rickinghall and Botesdale

This month it will be 25 years since the Rickinghall and Botesdale bypass was opened by Jeffrey Stansfield the County Surveyor. The main road had run through the villages since they were first settled. As it was the main route from Bury St Edmunds to Yarmouth and Norwich there was a great deal of traffic going through the villages and the medieval market was established in Botesdale in the early 13th century to take advantage of this.

The main road entering Rickinghall has had its route changed many times through history. It was thought by Basil Brown that in the Roman period the road may have gone from Botesdale through Burgate to the Roman road, now the A140. He also thought that the original road that runs from Bury into Rickinghall ran north of the road that has itself been replaced by the bypass. Apparently Snape Hill, once called Gallows Hill, where the gallows had been situated, was so steep that the 18th century coaches had difficulty ascending it so a new road was made to the south. He thought the line of very old oaks that cross the field south of Snape Farm lined the original road.

Upon entering the village of Rickinghall the road went down what is now the drive of Stanley Cottage, to what used to be the front (and is now the back) of Bridge House, across Water Lane and continued approximately where Brook House stands today, nearly forming two sides of a triangle. It appears like this on the Enclosure Map of 1818 but by 1839 when the Tithe Map was drawn the road was in the present position in front of Bridge House. A sales map dated 1837 has the new road pencilled in as if it was in the process of being changed.

In the medieval period the villages had the responsibility of keeping the roads repaired. In many wills of this time people left money for the roads to be mended. In 1455 Walter Skynnere, who had a house on the corner of Fen Lane and the Street, left 2 marks (26s 8d) 'To the repairing of the road in Rickinghall from the lane called 'Saryslane' as far as 2 marks will go.' In 1471 Alice Hervye left 12d 'To the reparation of a way called 'Bussysscloth.' Perhaps this was Bush Lane which used to lead off to the right at the end of Water Lane and was probably the packway to Allwood Green. (1)

In the 18th century, Turnpike Trusts were formed to improve and maintain the roads, with tolls charged along the roads. The main toll gate was situated at the end of Botesdale village where the toll house still stands. In the 1920s many roads were still dirt. It was then that they were sealed - stones were laid and tar poured over them - giving work to men returning from WWI.

The road through the village was a busy one and it is thought that as early as 1936 a bypass had been suggested. After WWII the road became busier until in the 1980s there were, apparently, over 8,000 vehicles passing through the villages every day.

Although many people wished to have a bypass because of 'the heavy volume of traffic with its attendant safety risks ... the trouble caused by traffic jams and the disturbance caused to those living in properties adjoining the Street', there were those who thought it would cut off the village and that trading would be drastically reduced.

In 1987 a public meeting was organised in Rickinghall Village Hall to discuss the four routes that a bypass could take. They were:- *Route A* – Outer Southern Option. (This was the one adopted).

Route B – Inner Southern Option. This would go nearer to the village than Route A and join the Diss Road near the water tower beyond the end of Botesdale village.

Route C – Inner Northern Option. This would go north of the villages, crossing the Hinderclay Road just beyond the Church Meadow houses, going north of Rose Lane and again joining the Diss Road at the Water tower.

Route D – Outer Northern Option. This would go north of Snape Farm and the Rectory, crossing the Hinderclay Road it would continue to the south of Broom Hills and again go north of Rose Lane joining the Diss Road at the water tower.

Most people preferred Route A and this is where the bypass runs today.

An Action Group was formed in 1989 to monitor the bypass proceedings and put pressure on the County Council to get the bypass built at the earliest opportunity. (2) In December 1992 the action committee heard that they had not been included for a bypass in 1993. However at last in October 1994 they were informed that work on the bypass would start in February 1995 to finish by September. Field walking and excavations were carried out by the Suffolk Archaeological Unit before work started. (3) The total cost was about £4.3 million. The approximate length is 2.6 miles.

The bypass was officially opened following the two minutes silence at 11 am on 11th November 1995 at the junction of Bury Road with the new bypass. This was followed by a

barbeque at the Bell Inn, Rickinghall. Events such as a Vintage Car Cavalcade along the bypass at 11.45am, a pram race between the Bell Inn and the White Horse Inn at 1.00 pm and a procession of decorated floats at 1.30 pm were organised to celebrate the opening.

Several businesses reported an increase in trade after the opening of the bypass because customers could park and cross the road more easily. As more people have more cars the village street is again getting busy but so far it is not as bad as in the pre-bypass days.

I have a friend who is a Christian. He has a great nephew who is in his teens and is into such things as skate boarding. Recently he had a very bad accident; something that involved him hitting his head very hard on the concrete producing significant damage to his skull, bleeding on the brain and brain damage itself. Things looked very bad and it was questionable whether he would live and if he did, whether he would be a cabbage or able to live anything like a normal life again. He was in hospital and under intensive care.

The Christians in the family prayed about the situation asking God for healing and peace for his parents as well as the rest of his family. His parents aren't Christians. Whether they prayed about the situation and asked for God to intervene, I don't know but what I know is that they not only encouraged the Christians to pray but asked that they did so. They showed considerable enthusiasm in their requests for prayer for their son.

Considering the initial situation, what happened was remarkable in that the lad made great strides in his recovery and now is back at school and, although still suffering a level of memory loss, is able to learn and is expected to do well.

One would have thought that having seen what the Christians there would describe as an intervention of God, that those parents would be making some move towards God and wanting to explore Christianity more but none of it. There can be no doubt that the medical profession did a really excellent job but they did ask for prayer, they got that prayer and God can use the medics to accomplish what he wants.

This isn't the only case I have experienced recently when someone has asked for God's help but once they had what they wanted, have totally ignored him. I have come across a man whose hands were badly injured and promised God that if he would provide healing he would follow him only to forget about it for years and years.

What does God say about this? What is his attitude to those that treat him in this way? He could say, "Human beings are ungrateful sods," and turn off any concern or love for them completely. We'd be very tempted to do exactly that.

We don't go much for the word sin these days but wouldn't it be reasonable to consider such lack of gratitude sin? If you are prepared to go that far you will find that God doesn't turn off his love and care but has gone the extra mile giving the life of his Son, Jesus to pay the price and purchase forgiveness for it and has that forgiveness on permanent offer for those that will turn to him.

That is all it needs. You may not understand church or what is said there, you may find it tedious and boring, you may not see the need for it and hate the idea but you might just find some people there who have experienced the love of Jesus and can help you to get to know about him better.

GOING POTTY

A number of you have posed questions on the ethics of using plastics in the garden and in particular plastic

I find plastic a useful material in the garden but only if I reuse it as many times as possible. Pots, seed trays, plastic cloches etc. all do their duty many times over. I do not see plastic as an enemy. It is the way we use it and dispose of it is the crucial factor.

We are all familiar with the appalling scenes of plastic pollution with discarded bottles and other detritus swilling around in rivers and the sea but at some point these articles will have been useful. Sadly the fault is people think they can simply throw things away and as if by magic, it will go away for ever!

I happen to prefer using plastic pots as they are far more robust than terracotta and are certainly lighter and don't dry out quite as quickly as their clay cousins. All plastic pots should be washed and reused. It is as simple as that but most gardeners will have stacks of used pots especially if they buy in plant from nurseries

Ideally, I suppose it would help if garden centres could take back clean unwanted pots for recycling but the big problem is the commonly used black pot is difficult for precycling machinery to 'read' so that route has reached a dead end.

I put this problem to my contact in the horticultural industry and was told there has been a lot of work going on behind the scenes to look for alternatives to the black plastic pot.

In fact, many more plants are now being sold in beige coloured fibre pots which the industry is keen to adopt

These fibre pots, once surplus to requirements, can be disposed of in your home recycling bins. Best check first with your local authority.

It seems to make sense to me to create a circular economy for pots; by making them in this country, using them, then recycling so they can be turned back into more pots



and garden centres.





BE SCAM SMART WATCH OUT FOR IMITATORS

Impersonation scams where a victim is hoodwinked into transferring money to criminals pretending to be from trusted organisations, have increased dramatically during the current pandemic.

According to UK Finance, the banking industry representative body, nearly 15,000 such scams took place in the first half of this year, a staggering increase of 84 per cent compared with the same period last year. **Victims lost £58 million to these scams!**

These criminals are extremely persuasive and obviously highly successful at their nefarious activities so be on your guard. If in any doubt about the authenticity of an organisation contact them directly but not via email or phone number shown on the suspect email.

UNPAID ROAD USE PENALTY CHARGE NOTICE

Emails have been circulating locally purporting to be from HM Courts & Tribunal Service claiming the recipient has not paid for driving on roads that has a charging scheme and as such, a penalty is payable.

Notably, details are omitted of the vehicle, the location, and the date or time of the incident.

These emails are **NOT GENUINE** and do not be tempted to click on the link. This is a phishing scam designed to steal your personal and financial information.

FAKE POLICE SCAM TWO LOCAL LADIES

This month we are highlighting recent scams involving two elderly ladies living locally.

The con artists pretended to be from the police called the two separate victims homes saying they were investigating fraudsters and wanted the victims help with their enquiries and to that end they needed to withdraw cash from their bank

What made it more plausible in one case they knew the name of the victim's grandson.

Both ladies were instructed to order a taxi to take them to their bank and withdraw £5000 in cash and return home to await a courier. They were given a code word to confirm with the courier.

Luckily, one of the ladies had a narrow escape. She became so confused at her bank she was unable to remember her PIN number correctly and the bank would not sanction the withdrawal and she left empty handed.

The other victim however did manage to obtain the money and later that day the courier duly arrived pass words were exchanged and the cash handed over. It was only later the victim realised she had been scammed. Understandably, she is feeling shaken, upset and very vulnerable.

A police spokesman said 'sadly this is a common and callous crime and the criminals are very convincing, so people must be on their quard.

Police officers never call people in this way and ask you to withdraw money or disclose personal or financial information. Anyone who receives a similar call should hang up immediately and not get involved in any dialogue with the caller'

If you are a friend, relative or carer of someone you think might be vulnerable to this type of trickery, please warn them and reinforce this advice. You might be the only person who can stop them falling victim to this despicable type of scam.




