Many years ago on a family holiday with our daughters we had a glorious couple of days on the Lincolnshire coast. There was sand for miles and it was ideal for making a sandcastle. We had great fun making it, and at the end of the day we left it. We went back to the same spot the next day, and to our surprise and delight it was still there. The tide had not washed it away, so we continued to enjoy it and care for it! But we did know that eventually the tide would wash it away, and what was once there would be there no more. Thinking on the death of HRH Prince Philip reminds me of that occasion and of a saying that you may be familiar with... life is like a sandcastle on a beach! You build it, tend it, enjoy it, but you know it is only temporary, for you will have to let it go... the tide comes in and washes it away.

When reading the Bible we read about the reality of life; death hangs like a funeral pall over the coffin of life. There is a sombre repetition of the phrase "and then he died". This serves as a reminder that our efforts to extend the realms of our existence are checkmated by death. Even our most noteworthy achievements are neutralised by death and washed away by the ocean waves of time. Regrettably, generations in the distant future will not even remember us and our collective efforts.

But there is good news! For believers in Jesus Christ as the Son of God the sting of death is overcome by the hope of His resurrection, a truth made clear in 1 Corinthians 15:50-58. In this "lyrical passage," the author Paul exults in the triumph Christ has won over death itself. Paul repeated in plain terms that natural, earthly bodies are not suited to a spiritual, heavenly existence. Indeed, that which is subject to death and decomposition could never receive as an inheritance that which is eternal and glorious in nature (v50). The good news is that living, as well as deceased believers, will have their bodies transformed at the Messiah's return (v51).

So what is this all about? Well, perishable, mortal bodies are unfit to inhabit heaven, they need to be transformed into imperishable, immortal ones (v53). This does not mean that the earthly and heavenly bodies are completely different, for there is a fundamental continuity of identity between the old and new. This can be described like a person putting on a new robe (v54). Paul's quote from Isaiah 25:8 indicates that the sovereign Lord completely checkmates death. In 1 Corinthians 15:55, Paul also quotes from Hosea 13:14 as if to taunt death, who is a loser and does not have ultimate power to inflict harm on God's people.

Death has been described in many ways, like a poisonous hornet or scorpion whose stinger has been pulled. By Jesus' own atoning sacrifice on the cross and resurrection from the grave, He dealt a fatal blow to death. The truth is this: all people must die; but when the Messiah returns, He will raise all who have trusted in Him for eternal life, and they will be rescued from death forever. In this way, the arch-enemy of all humanity, the pain of death, is going to be completely overwhelmed by God's invincible supernatural power.

This pain of death is caused by the presence of sin in the world and in our own personal lives. In 1 Corinthians 15:56, Paul tells us, his readers, that it was through the presence of sin that death received its power to hurt believers. After Adam disobeyed God's command, death invaded his life and the life of all his descendants (cf. Romans 5:12). Sin gains its power from the law by using God's commands to produce all sorts of wrong desires in people and to seduce them into disobeying the Creator (cf. Rom. 7:7-11). The Bible is clear, people who reject the Lord are powerless to resist sin or overcome death. Paul gave thanks to the Father for the triumph available through faith in the Son (1 Cor. 15:57).

Paul, the apostle, exhorts us to remain steadfast in his teaching and resolute in the faith, for we have ultimate victory in the Redeemer (v58). The hope of the Resurrection is meant to spur all on to serve the Lord diligently and wholeheartedly. With such an attitude our efforts will never be wasted, since in Christ they will bear eternal fruit and reap a heavenly reward. From this it is clear that only in Christ can work and leisure be enjoyable, beneficial, and fulfilling for people of faith. So as you reflect on the life of HRH Prince Philip don't ponder on the finality of death, instead ponder on the hope of life everlasting in the presence of the Almighty God, where we will be clothed with a new body fully fit to live eternally. RICKINGHALL RAMBLERS...

... hope to restart walks on Monday 17 May, with another planned for Friday 28 May. These first two will be local walks of about 3.5 miles beginning at Rickinghall Village Hall at 9.15am. We do leave sharply on time. If permitted, a full programme will be planned after these initial walks.

The Rickinghall Ramblers was founded nearly 30 years ago but has been thriving as an informal group who enjoy talking while walking in the local area. Some members take it in turns to organise a walk of four to six miles, meeting at Rickinghall Village Hall on alternate Mondays or Fridays and departing at 9.15am, ie a walk every 10 or 11 days. Walk dates are advertised in the Parish magazine and on notice board posters in Botesdale and Rickinghall. Most walks have 12 -18 walkers. We are not a formal organisation, do not charge any fees, and are not insured.

It has not been possible to walk during the last year because of COVID restrictions - at the time of writing, the government website for COVID has not defined which groups of up to 30 people will be allowed to meet or the conditions for such meetings. The Rickinghall Ramblers will continue to operate on the principle that everyone participates on a walk at their own risk. However, we do hope that we will be able to walk again as a group if we follow these guidelines:

- No one should come on a walk if they or anyone in their household is feeling unwell or suffering from the symptoms of COVID
- On the walk, we should observe social distancing
- Walk leaders should identify possible pinch points where people might bunch together e.g. at a stile or when crossing a road
- Sharing cars is not encouraged but is left to individual choice
- A maximum of only 30 walkers will be allowed until at least 21 June
- A list of walkers will be kept for three weeks in case someone is diagnosed with COVID after a walk

We are looking forward to the opportunity to meet other people from the local area and enjoy a walk in the countryside. Everyone is welcome to come along. Unfortunately, dogs are not allowed on walks.

Report from the Botesdale PC Meeting April 2021

All five members of the Parish Council were present for the meeting. The PC is currently down by four members and we'd love to hear from you if you'd like to be more involved in your local community. The time required depends on how much you'd like to get involved and that is totally up to you, but it is usually 3-4 hours a month including the monthly meeting. Just give the Clerk a call or email for more information.

This year the April PC meeting was preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting. The APM provides an opportunity for parishioners to discuss parish affairs, and for village organisations to tell them what they've been doing over the past year. It is not to be confused with the annual meeting of the Parish Council in May, where the Chairman is elected, and other annual business is conducted (similar to an AGM). We have received a surprising number of reports from local organisations, given the current circumstances and the inability in most cases to hold meetings! These will be posted on the BPC website and in the Botesdale Bugle which you will receive in the summer. We then proceeded with the regular meeting of the Parish Council.

Public Forum: There were no members of the public present.

Correspondence: A resident has gone to some effort to evaluate our three circular walks in Botesdale and Rickinghall and sent us a comprehensive plan to improve the waymarking so that they are more easily navigated. We've gratefully taken them up on the offer and are trying to source new waymarkers and posts for the project.

We also received extensive comments on the Recreation Ground Regeneration project from a resident who attended the design presentation at our March meeting. The PC approved a response which addressed all the issues raised.

Village Assets Refurbishment: You may recall that we reported in the February magazine about another project to improve our village. Cllr Bavington -Lowe put together a condition report on village assets. The PC has now agreed quotes for the work which will include refurbishing benches, litter and grit bins, notice boards, etc and replacing a few items where necessary. You should see those improvements over the next few months.

Recreation Ground Regeneration: The next stage of the Project is focused on getting the necessary funding for the project and increasing community

engagement while the designers continue to finetune the design and facilities. The plan for the Project is that work will start on site this autumn with completion marked for Spring 2022.

Sarah's Wood: The PC was offered the woodland next to the school as part of the Section 106 agreement Mid Suffolk District Council has with Burgess Homes, who are building the new houses at Back Hills. The Wood, which was originally owned by Sarah Holt-Wilson, is currently partly used by the Pre-School and the rest is unused. We will be talking to the Pre-School and St Botolph's School about its future use in the upcoming months.

Grant Funding: Local grants have been agreed for the Parochial Church Council for local churchyard maintenance, the Rickinghall Day Centre, Barwoods (for public liability insurance for Millers Orchard) and to the Botesdale After School Club. Most payments will be made in May. If you are a local organisation with need of additional funding for a specific project, please contact the Clerk.

Walks Leaflets: These have been extremely popular. If you are unaware of their existence, you can download a copy on the website or get a hard copy from the dispenser opposite the Greyhound Pub. Together with Rickinghall PC, we are ordering 3,000 new copies.

Streams and Footpaths: A small group of individuals have made a huge difference to the state of the streams at the bottom of Fen Lane. The PC is doing its part to help them by arranging for the removal of two large piles of tree debris!

Redgrave April 2021 Report – by the Clerk

All eight councillors attended this meeting on Zoom. Councillors were pleased to welcome Andy Warnes onto the Parish Council, which is now up to full complement!

Public Forum: County/District Councillor Jessica Fleming reported that Suffolk Growth are organising and facilitating a range of events and training opportunities throughout 2021/22. Attendance from public and private sector is welcome to help develop tangible actions that can address the challenges and opportunities in revitalising the economy across Suffolk. Email info@suffolkgrowth.co.uk to register interest.

Suffolk County Council in partnership with Suffolk Constabulary (the Suffolk Roadsafe Partnership) will trial use of ANPR cameras to tackle speeding hot spots across the County as part of a 2-year pilot. An ANPR camera could be installed at a site where there is a problem with speeding and/or rat-running on roads with a 20 or 30mph speed limits. Repeat offences at a particular location could prompt the deployment of SafeCam (the Police's enforcement team) and fines. More information can be found at https://suffolkroadsafe.com/speeding/speed-prevention-in-communities

Restart Grants Available as of 1st April - Business owners who are rate payers in Mid Suffolk may be eligible for further Covid-19 support grants through the current lockdown. https://www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/business/business-rates/grant-funding-schemes/

Suffolk Lorry Route Review: A review of Suffolk's heavy goods vehicle (HGV) routes has been planned for some time, the work will resume this coming summer and include a survey for parishes and towns in Suffolk. In the meantime, residents or businesses who wish to give feedback on HGV movements should contact the parish council. Find out more information at: www.suffolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/lorry-management/lorry-route-plan-review-in-suffolk/

Litter picks: Mid Suffolk is once again supporting local litter picks under distancing restrictions. Contact the District Council at Public.realm@baberghmidsuffolk.gov.uk if interested in volunteering individually or in small groups.

Planning: There was one planning application on land east of Hall Farm, Churchway for change of use of the land for an Electric

Motorcycle Track. It was noted that the application was for retention of a partially constructed track on the site. The PC had no objection subject to certain conditions being met, including commitment to use by electric vehicles only, adequate security to prevent use out of hours, no lighting, restriction of the number of bikes per booking and no use other than by customers there for purchase of goods.

Neighbourhood Plan: There had been a delay in updating the Plan and it will now be issued to the PC for discussion at the May meeting.

Traffic Matters: The PC discussed several traffic matters including the Speedwatch group's request for an additional vehicle activated sign. Quotes had been received and the group had expressed a preference for a Morelock VAS with a quoted price of £2,753. Funds have been put aside in this year's budget for the purchase and the quote was accepted. The PC also received a resident's request to extend the 30mph zone on Hinderclay Road and has agreed to investigate moving it to Crackthorn Bridge. Finally, the PC had been copied into a letter to Suffolk County Council from a resident relating to the upcoming Suffolk Lorry Route Review. The comments on damaging and disruptive lorry traffic through the village have been noted by the PC for the upcoming review.

New Dog Bin: The PC is installing a new dog bin on The Green. Please use it!!

Parish Council Report April 2021 by Cllr Geoff Short

At our April meeting we welcomed back Stephen Pattenden to join the council, which helps the numbers, and avoids any 'quorate issues' - thank you, Stephen.

County Councillor Jessica Fleming advised a Government grant had been given to the Suffolk Growth partnership, and training and events would be held to revitalise the local economy.

Testing kits for Covid were being sent to homes rather than test centres for the lateral flow testing programme, but these were not to be recycled in the waste, which was obviously causing problems.

Commercial bus services were being looked at under a full review, as it is unlikely that their use will be restored to pre-Covid levels ever, and they are running with only a handful of passengers.

SCC has invested in some new ANPR speed cameras to identify repeat offenders, which villages can apply to have installed for short periods.

On the District Council, the Draft Local Plan had gone to the Secretary of State and was now in the examination stage. When adopted, it will take over from the Local Plan in use since 1998.

The District Council is now supporting litter picks again, and the Parish Council will organise one later in the year round the village.

We looked at three planning applications, one being a poultry farm enterprise, and two householder improvements in The Street, and all had 'no objection' outcomes.

Likewise, there were three tree applications, in Bury Road, Water Lane and Garden House Lane, and there were also no objections.

Three items of correspondence from residents were discussed, one being to

improve the waymarkers on the circular walks around the village. The resident was offering to erect the signs if we supplied them - an offer we were pleased to accept! For those new to the village, there is a notice board adjacent to the phone box in the Market Place, and this displays the walks. Attached to it is a dispenser with walks leaflets enclosed, and these can be used to assist your way round the footpaths.

A survey was recently sent to groups, clubs and organisations around the village in respect of the Parish Infrastructure Investment Plan requesting input on the CIL funds available. There was a good response, and the results are now being collated.

We give out a pack of information to new residents moving into the village, and there have been quite a few issued recently, both to new build properties and existing houses in the flurry of reduced stamp duty moves that are taking place. So welcome to those new to Rickinghall, and we sincerely hope you quickly settle into your new homes in the village. Let's hope the road map out of lockdown proceeds as planned, and we can all look forward to a good summer with some form of normality.



Bervl Waters

HRH Prince Philip died on April 9th two months before his one hundredth birthday. Beryl Waters, of Botesdale, sadly died on Christmas Eve 2020, less than four months before reaching one hundred. She had a similar character and sense of humour, putting family and community before herself.



Although Beryl lived in Suffolk for more than seventy years she was born in Ealing, in 1921, and had three elder siblings and a younger brother. She lived in Sunbury on Thames and attended St. Theresa's Convent school until she was sixteen. She enjoyed going to school and often reminisced about the environment of the convent and the nuns' kindness. At the young age of eight she made a personal vow to be open minded towards spirituality and religion.

Beryl left school at sixteen and her family moved to Great Baddow, and she trained as a secretary at Braintree Tutorial College. Her father organised her first job as a shorthand typist at Essex County Council. Beryl was an excellent typist and loved book-keeping but admitted to being awful at shorthand. She did not enjoy the job so left as soon as possible and worked at a kennels in Braintree. Beryl then worked as a ledger clerk for Barclays Bank which she loved. Part of her duties during WWII included fire watching at night at the bank. She often recalled hiding in ditches on the golf course when planes were fighting overhead. During the war Beryl was drafted into the land army as a milk maid. She loved this work until one farmer expected her to hedge and ditch, and only milk the cows once a week. She refused and was required to leave the Land Army. Beryl's next job was working for the Duke of Bedford at Woburn Abbey as farm secretary which she loved.

Beryl came to Suffolk in 1948 to work for Squire John Holt Wilson and Mr Tom Horsfall at Hinderclay Hall. One of her first jobs was to individually reply to the hundreds of people expressing condolences following the fatal accident of Tom's brother Jock Horsfall, the famous racing driver and war time secret agent involved in Operation Mincemeat. After marrying Arthur, the Squire's pig manager, in 1950 in Redgrave Church, they moved into Street Farm, Botesdale.

Jean Bennett (formerly Simonds) and Beryl became great friends after the birth of Jean's first son Simon and before the birth of Beryl's eldest son, Peter, a few months later in June 1951 and they remained close friends all their lives. Shortly before the birth of Beryl's second son John in 1952 the couple bought Lone Pine in Cherry Tree Lane which she lived in for over sixty years. Andrew was born in 1954 and finally Christine was born in 1957. The two families were friends all their lives and had many family holidays together.

Beryl was Captain of the Girl Guides in the 1960s.

The sudden death of her mother in 1963 was followed by Arthur in 1967 after seventeen years of marriage. Beryl never re-married as

she wanted to put her children first. At this time she said she put her faith truly in God to provide for herself and family.

During the 1960s Beryl worked briefly for a travel agency and Elizabeth Craig, a well-known cook and writer who lived at St Catherine's in Botesdale. Beryl then worked as Secretary for Ixworth School for twenty-five years which she really enjoyed. After retiring she did some secretarial work for Simonds Garage of Botesdale.

Beryl did not take things easy in retirement and was very actively engaged in church and community work. She was clerk to Rickinghall and Redgrave Parish Councils, facilitating numerous choirs and treasurer of the 'Forget Me Not Club' in Botesdale which had been founded by her mother. Beryl was organist at the two Rickinghall churches, Redgrave, Botesdale and Hinderclay, and requested that on her gravestone near to the porch of Rickinghall Inferior Church, it should say that she had been organist at Rickinghall for more than fifty years. Beryl took on the role of Churchwarden for Botesdale Chapel of Ease at the age of 90. Although I did not really get to know Beryl personally until 2004, I know how efficient she was at the jobs which she took on. When my husband was Chairman of Redgrave Parish Council for a short time in the 1970s, they had a council meeting one evening and before she went to work the following morning, she brought the completed minutes of the meeting to Redgrave. When I was churchwarden of Rickinghall Inferior Church and the weekly collections from at least two services were mainly collected in cash, she would enter it all in the books and take the money into the post office by Monday afternoon. She even managed to do this for a few weeks after breaking her wrist.

The many talents Beryl had were self-taught including playing the organ, piano, singing, painting, drawing and upholstery.

Accountancy was taught to her by her father, Frederick Baker, whom she loved and he moved to Lone Pine after his wife's death, and died at the great age of 102.

Beryl was good at organising events and had even planned her funeral several years in advance and made a recording of her life the day before the covid lockdown in 2020.

Beryl continued driving until after the age of 90, much to her family's consternation. She always said 'the good Lord's looking after me' which fortunately he did. Beryl always told her family she wanted a quiet 90th birthday party but then changed her mind and organised a big party with 180 guests.

Her son John sadly was taken ill in 2012 and died in 2013. By this time Beryl's health had also declined and she was in hospital and could not face living in Lone Pine by herself. She moved into Fornham House and then to Walcot Hall Nursing home in Diss in 2016 to be closer to her family whom she loved dearly. She was able to come and stay with them for weekends and meet up with Jean Bennett until the pandemic hit nursing homes. During the final weeks she was allowed to have visits from family and was pleased to hear about the birth of her 4th great grandchild a few days before her death.

Although Beryl may not have had the exciting life of the Duke of Edinburgh, her character and age were so similar.

Exploring the Past Again

Memories of a difficult year

Last May, after we had been in Lockdown from Coronavirus for a month or so, I wrote about an earlier pandemic that swept through the world, reaching our villages in 1349.

There have been several major plagues in the past that we know of; the Egyptian plagues in the Bible, the Justinian Plague of the 540s, the Black Death, the 1665 plague, the 1918 Spanish Flu. Many were hardly recorded at all and we only know of them through references in other writings.

This pandemic will be recorded in many new ways, such as social media.

At the moment we can remember when things happened, when rules changed, when we had to go into different Tiers or Lockdowns, but in a few years the memories will fade. So we need to remember and document what it was like for us in our villages during this time.

A village history recorder records events of today for future historians, so I have been recording this pandemic and the way the new rules and regulations affected us all. Here are a few of my notes - For instance when our villages, like the rest of the country, went into 'Lockdown' in March 2020 older and vulnerable people had to stay in their homes and 'shield'. People, who could, had to start working from home. Schools closed, with the children having to be 'home schooled', they did not reopen again until September. All the usual village events were cancelled and did not resume even when we came out of Lockdown for the Summer months

Many things in our lives changed; hands had to be washed with soap for 20 seconds and hand sanitizer appeared in all shops. Social distancing was required - not to get closer than 2 metres to anyone. New words appeared in our vocabulary; Lockdown, self isolate, social distance, shielding, Zoom and of course Coronavirus or Covid-19. When it was suggested by the government that masks should be worn everyone started making them. Scrubs and bags, to put scrubs in, were also being made in the villages for NHS front line staff.

During the first two months every Thursday evening at 8pm people stood at their front doors and clapped for NHS. There were pictures of Rainbows, a symbol of support for the NHS, in many windows and children had also chalked them onto walls along the village street.

The three churches in the villages; the Church of England, Methodist Chapel and Parkview Chapel, immediately organised help for people who were shielding and had to stay in their homes. People volunteered and were organised to help with picking up prescriptions, shopping, posting mail, walking dogs or anything else that might need doing. This was a great community effort.

The Rickinghall Co-op shop stayed open throughout the time of Lockdown. A 'one out one in' policy was implemented so there weren't too many people in the shop at one time. Everyone had to wear masks and follow a one way route round the shop.

The Farm shop also stayed open to buy fresh fruit and vegetables. It has a very small shop space so only one person was allowed in at a time and all had to wear masks. 'Highways', selling their free range meats and home made produce, stayed open and also had a delivery service. The Community Shop in Redgrave was open the whole time, an amazing effort by the volunteers.

Take away meals could be ordered from The Fish and Chip shop and the three village pubs, The Cross Keys, The Bell and The Greyhound. These had to be ordered beforehand and picked up from outside the premises. Not to be able to actually visit a pub was very difficult!

An interesting new way of communicating was the introduction to most of

us of 'Zooming'. Organisations very quickly organised Zoom talks. Most families soon learnt to keep in touch with weekly Zooms. The older generation of Baby Boomers became known as Baby Zoomers. Other forms of social media were useful to keep in touch with what was happening in the neighbourhood.

Ordering goods online became a normal way of buying, although for the first month or so it was very difficult to get a delivery slot from the supermarkets. They ran out of several items – loo rolls, bread flour and pasta were all impossible to get at first. Why loo rolls?!

In July things had been relaxed a little so we were able to go into town, to go shopping. Pubs reopened although only outside tables were available, however by August it was possible to eat at inside tables. These had to be booked in advance and contact details were taken, in case someone was later found to have Covid. Only table service was allowed so people were not permitted to walk around inside.

The Farmers' Market opened again but with only seven stalls in the hall, to comply with the regulations, the rest had to be outside. Luckily during the Summer the weather was good. However the market carried on until December with an outside cafe and everyone wrapping up warmly! It reopened in March.


The village churches stayed closed for services which took place on 'Zoom' or YouTube instead. During the whole time the Parish Magazine was published monthly as it usually is, which was such a good effort by the editorial team.

In January we went into a third Lockdown. Schools again had to close, the children being taught via online lessons. People again had to work from home. The pubs had to close but again they offered takeaways. This Lockdown seemed to be far more difficult than the previous two. The first one was during the Summer so time was spent in our gardens. The second one, although in November, only lasted for a month but the early dark nights and grey days made this third one far more depressing than the other two.

By the end of 2020 various vaccines had been developed. The Pfizer vaccine was the first one to become available in December, with the AstraZeneca vaccine starting to be given in January. By March a high proportion of over 60s had had a first dose. Let's hope that the vaccines will save us from having to go into Lockdown again and life will go back to near normal.

A quote from the Duchess of Cambridge:

'When we look back at the Covid-19 experience in decades to come, we will think of the challenges we all faced ... but we will also remember the positives and how together we adapted to a new normal'.

When I was a pastor, after a period of rotten weather, one of the congregation asked me, "Can't you do something about this weather?" My answer was, "That's management. I'm sales."

God is management. Christians are sales.

Perhaps life should be thought of as a game of snakes and ladders. Covid has produced some very long and nasty snakes in life for many people. Some Christians appear to think that being a Christian means that you only land on ladders. I recently heard an American evangelist actually telling people that. He claimed never to be ill or have any problems and was offering that, for any that put their trust in Jesus

Let me tell you, "He offers a false hope, a false promise, a false Jesus and a fake message."

The apostle Paul was not only the greatest evangelist, he wrote much of the New Testament showing us what faith in Jesus does for us. Here is how he described his life as he proclaimed the message,

"I experienced great labours, imprisonments, with countless beatings, and was often near death. Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea."

He found that the Christian life often landed him on a snake.

He didn't find being a Christian gave him the easy life often offered by many Christians today. They convince themselves by being inconsistent in life, crediting God with the good and never the bad. By speaking of the blessings but never the hardships.

I observe that many non-Christians can be similarly inconsistent in ignoring the bad. Christianity has a heaven and a hell, eternal life and death and right and wrong. If there is the slightest chance that these exist it is very important to know. A friend once suggested that as you opened your mouth to tell them people can produce three evasive manoeuvres before the first word comes out. I find the same, a mere mention of anything Christian is met with deliberate avoidance of the subject. The probability of having to give account of our lives to God must be far greater that that of getting blood clots from a vaccine, yet society is far more frightened by the latter.

Whether we are Christians or not, life brings the good and the bad. It is a game of snakes and ladders. At the end of life there is a snake but whether we land on it isn't determined by the throw of a dice.

In the Old Testament Jacob had a vision of a ladder reaching up to heaven. He exclaimed , "Surely the Lord is in this place and I didn't

Jesus used this vision of Jacob's to present himself as the ladder to

Stepping onto the ladder now, avoids landing on the snake at the end of life.

"Behold, there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it!"

Genesis Ch 28 v.12

"Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."



IN YOUR GARDEN

My recent piece on the use of peat resulted in a number of you making contact (nice to know the column is actually read) saying peat free alternatives are now more readily available and were going to convert to more environmentally friendly alternatives. That is great news and the more gardeners and the horticultural industry leave peat where it belongs in its natural surroundings, the better for our fragile environment. In a similar vein several also raised the topic of how can they make their garden more wildlife friendly certainly not for deer, rabbits and wood pigeons. I am thinking more about our essential pollinating friends the bees and their colourful counterparts, the butterfly. Recent figures have shown nearly 300 bee species have been recorded in the UK. That may sound a staggering number, but put into the context of over 16,000 worldwide, it's a mere trifle and sadly 47 of our home species are either at risk or have been lost forever. The story with butterflies is even more dire with nearly 80per cent of our resident and migratory species having declined in the last couple of decades according to the State of UK Butterflies report. This damaging decline is the result of habitat loss, the mass use of pesticides, climate changes and disease from invasive arrivals from foreign climes. So, what can we do to give a helping hand to both the bees and butterflies? Firstly, we can plant up our gardens with varieties rich in nectar and pollen. Nectar is a most important food source whilst pollen provides protein that helps make bees less prone to disease. Not only can we create habitats to welcome them to our gardens but encourage them to stay around. On the question of the sting risk the old adage 'if you don't bother them, they will leave you alone' has always worked where I have been concerned. There's a vast range of plants we can put in our garden to encourage both the bees and butterflies and you should be aiming for varieties that cover the whole growing season as some species are out and about when their natural food is scarce. The ideal mix of flowers would be cottage garden plants such as asters, foxgloves, sedum, salvias, campanula, lavender cosmos, scabious, On the early spring front, bulbs that are good for both bees and butterflies include snowdrops, winter aconite, crocus as well as shrubs such as mahonia, honeysuckle and the bee and butterfly bush supreme buddleia. For a more comprehensive list go to the RHS web site Plants for Pollinators (rhs.org.uk) For further encouragement, I have left one area of my garden as a wild location primarily because it is overshadowed by tall mature trees on a neighbouring area of land. It is important to set aside such spots so as to provide food, shelter for birds, insects and of course the bees. I know this won't meet with the approval of some gardeners who like to keep things neat and tidy so I suggest a happy medium and devote a bed or two to grow wild flowers to attract the pollinators. If you invite more insects into your garden, they will be attractive to other wildlife, many of which are under serious threat from loss of habitat and sources of food. Varieties of wildflower seeds are available and once they have matured, they will brighten your garden with a display of traditional favourites such as flax, larkspur, poppy, cornflower and borage. The seeds should be scattered on well raked soiled and lightly firmed. It will keep cats and hungry pigeons away by either netting or placing twigs over the area until the plants have fully germinated. If you are lucky, the plants will self-seed to give you a continuing display for years to come. Enjoy your garden.

The plague was made by Gilbert Burroughes an expert in reproduction Samian ware, (high status Roman Pottery). Gilbert was also a colleague of Basil. It commemorates the 70th anniversary of the discovery of the ship burial and depicts the now famous photo of Basil standing in the impression of the boat in the sandy soil.



BE SCAM SMART

Scammers are stepping up their efforts to harass, pressurise, and steal considerable amounts of money particularly from the elderly and the vulnerable with a barrage of telephone calls and emails.

The approaches cover everything from aggressive sales pitches to investment 'opportunities'.

The one thing they have in common, they were not requested by the recipient.

Official figures show that complaints about such attempted fraud have almost doubled in the months following the first national lock down a year ago. Some 13,000 complaints about unwanted telephone calls, texts and emails were recorded. But these numbers do not tell the full story as most people affected don't make an official complaint due primarily to embarrassment.

The figures also indicate that these predators are targetting the elderly and even more despicably, dementia sufferers. One woman with dementia was hounded by an average of 100 nuisance calls a month.

Once again we can only repeat, be very wary of cold calls or emails from unknown sources and **NEVER** give or confirm personal or financial details unless you are 100 per cent sure the approach is bone fide.

As well as the regular scams purporting to be from banks, Post Office, Amazon, DLVC, etc. that have been previously publicised in this column, we have been asked by Trading Standards to alert readers of **fake Curry's PC**World emails being circulated locally.

The emails state the recipient has been selected to win a range of electrical products. These are bogus and not sent by Curry's PC World, but are phishing emails to obtain your personal information.

If you have received a phone call you believe to be a scam or have been a victim of an online fraud, report it to the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 223 1133

If you have compromised the safety of your bank details, you should contact your bank immediately.

WATCH OUT FOR CENSUS SCAMS

Police have issued an urgent alert about bogus Census Field Officers visiting people who have still to complete the 2021 census.

Currently, official census branded reminder letters are being sent out by post to households who have yet to complete their forms.

Bona fide Census Field Officers, who carry official identification, are calling at homes to provide help with compiling the census on line and also advise on any support services available.

However, incidents have been reported of persons posing as census officials targeting homes and obtaining money and personal details by deception.

Census Field Officers will **NEVER** ask for any form of payment, inspect personal documents such as pay slips, passports or birth certificates. Nor will they ask for your bank details or National Insurance number.

YOU WILL NEVER BE ISSUED WITH A FINE by a Field Officer or via a text message, phone call or email.




