TESTIMONIES ARE TRUE

As Churchwarden at St Mary's Church, Rickinghall, Kit Brinkley shares his faith in Jesus Christ to encourage others.

The truth of the reality of God is seen in each of these personal testimonies

They confirm that Christianity isn't a religion but a divine relationship with Jesus Christ, the most important decision anyone can make in this life.

On 7th January 1994 aged 21 years, Juliet took her own life; a beautiful, loving young woman, thereby breaking the hearts of her devastated family. I'd been speaking with her a week before she died discussing the Christian Alpha Courses where she would find answers to 'Questions Of Life'. In her farewell note she wrote that she felt inadequate; she was sorry, but not to worry. If only she'd joined me on that Alpha Course, because it changed my life forever.

In 1988 after a divorce, business failure, with the house sold and needing to re-build my life, I well recall crying out to God for help. I'd been going to church for many years, but it wasn't until I opened my heart to Jesus Christ that everything changed.

Within a week of that lowest point of despair just one phone call to a friend in London opened the door for a trial period of 3 months' work in the exhibition industry, a job that lasted 8 years, a new home, a wonderful re-marriage, an international franchise business, serving local churches and the Norwich Chapter of the Full Gospel Businessmen UK. And I'm still working!

1994 after my first Alpha Course I was at Earl's Court Tube Station longing to share John Stott's amazing book 'The Cross of Christ'. In the crowd I spotted a nun dressed in her black habit, so I asked her 'Have you read this book?' I'll never forget her sweet face and gentle reply: "Pardon Monsieur, mais je suis française!" God also has a real sense of humour.

In marked contrast in Riyadh at one of our franchise conferences I was asked by a senior Saudi businessman why he should trust my Company as consultants. After a pause I looked him in the eye and said that I had faith in my

God and that He was my judge. For us that is sufficient, he said.

At an exhibition in Dubai, our speaker Murad Alnasur excused himself as his wife had been rushed to hospital. I suggested we pray for her. On his return he said that she'd been sent home early . . . Let's give thanks I said, and since then he always calls me his brother!

In 2000 Rev David Clayden at Thorndon Church urgently needed triple bypass heart surgery. Rather than wait we agreed to raise the money for the Papworth operation. £12,000 was the sum estimated. I watched in amazement as all the money came in. The full amount was paid on time – although the date for the operation had been brought forward by several months. Remarkably, not one extra penny was ever given. Heaven's tap had been turned off.

The Bible says a lot about money.

At St Mary's Yaxley the repair works needed £45,000 and we were weary with fund raising.

Soon after praying we received a cheque for £6,000 from the estate of the late Thomas Felgate, whom no one had heard of.

The lawyer's letter confirmed that we were also to receive 10% of the £450,000 legacy

Malcolm Springall recently joined our regular Friday Zoom call lying in bed, hardly able to move.

I asked his wife to put her hand firmly on the pain in his back. Then, being told to get up we watched him touch his toes. He rang early the next morning saying he was cleaning his windows!

For the first time I offered to pray for my dear father at the end of his life telling him that on Alpha we should step out in faith to pray for the sick: reluctantly he agreed, and in tears I asked God to heal his stomach cancer. The next morning my mother rang to say that he'd had a good night and the pain had left him. I was by his side in the Hospice when he died after being given an extra six months of life.

Referring to John Stott, he wrote a book about his life called 'Why I am a Christian'. His answer is also mine 'Because it's True'.





Report from the April 2023 Botesdale PC Meeting

Public Forum: County Cllr Jessica Fleming reported that Milestone Infrastructure, part of M Group Services, has been awarded Suffolk's new highway projects and improvements, including maintaining roads, pavements and rights of way, drainage, hedge trimming, construction of new road schemes, snow-clearing and gritting. Street lighting is awarded separately.

School Travel and Admissions - The School Travel Policy can be found at www.suffolkonboard.com/schooltravel. The Passenger Transport Team should have notified parents by the end of March of their school travel funding. Any parents who may not have heard but think their child to be eligible should contact us on 0345 606 6173. For advice on admissions, admission appeals or SCC funded school travel please contact us on the following numbers: Angela Davey on 01473 260978, Jasmine Eastwood on 01473 260070, or Jan Scott on 01473 264657.

Planning: The PC considered one application for the erection of 4 houses on the Former Concrete Hardstanding, Chapel Lane. The issue of insufficient parking on Chapel Lane was discussed and it has been agreed to approach Bennett Homes to ask for a parking layby alongside the new houses. However, the PC acknowledged that this was not a material consideration and there could be no legal objection to the application.

Recreation Ground: The new Ground officially opened on 1st April as planned and it is clearly already very popular. The PC extends its official thanks to the members of the Recreation Ground Regeneration Sub Committee. We think that there is a lot of Recreation Ground for the money and we hope you agree. We will be asking for your feedback in the near future.

Urban Forestry of Bury St Edmunds carried out the installation and will be carrying out the maintenance of the site over the next 12 months. The PC has set up a new Sub Committee to oversee this and if you would like to be involved in this and/or any casual caretaking of the site, please get in touch. We already have a couple of volunteers who are up there regularly!

Parish Infrastructure Investment Plan (PIIP: The Parish Council is pleased to be able to support St Botolph's School with £11,840 from Parish Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Funds. This will go towards the installation of two new boilers. The PC currently holds £51,772.05 in CIL Funds and local organisations are welcome to apply for support for capital projects. However, priority is given to projects already identified within the PIIP (see on our website at http://botesdale.onesuffolk.net/neighbourhood-plan/parish-infrastructure-investment-plan-piip/).

Another PIIP application was agreed between meetings - from the Health Centre Patient Participation Group for £250 of supplies for an Art Therapy Group starting in May. It was agreed that as this is not infrastructure, it will be paid from the PC's regular grant funds.

Parking on Back Hills near The Fairstead: Further to previous discussions, the PC was disappointed to hear that Botesdale Health Centre was unable to add to text messages to patients requesting considerate parking near the Centre.

Parking on The Street opp Mill Road North: The PC has received complaints about parking too near this junction and will ask Suffolk County Council Highways to reassess the possibility of double-yellow lines at this site. If agreed, these will simply reinforce the Highway Code Restrictions.

We reported at the last meeting that we would be able to combine Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO) for double-yellow lines at The Fairstead and at the junction of Bridewell Lane and Chapel Lane, as well as the extension of the 30mph speed limit on B1113. Sadly, the PC has been told by SCC Highways that a TRO for double-yellow lines at these two sites and the potential site at Mill Road North will have to be carried out separately from a TRO for extension of the 30mph speed limit as they are different legal procedures. The PC has agreed the expenditure of around £7,000 for each TRO, which will come from CIL Funds.

Street Lighting: The PC is pleased to say that all but two of the 22 Parish-owned streetlights have now been updated to LED lamps. This has been a multi-year project and should see significant benefit for our electricity payments and for the environment.

Highways Issues: It was reported that there are an increasing number of drivers exiting the dental surgery who turn left onto The Drift against the one-way restriction. It was agreed to ask the owner to display their "no left turn" sign more prominently if possible. The Clerk will also ask SCC to renew the "no entry" sign at the junction with Back Hills.

Botesdale Brook: The PC will be installing an information board near the stream at the bottom of Fen Lane, at a cost of approximately £570. This will celebrate the Brook's role as the primary headwater of the Little Ouse.

Parish Council Report – April 2023 By Alison Spouncer, Parish Clerk

The meeting for April 2023 had four apologies from Councillors. County and District Councillor Fleming and her District Councillor successor, Cllr Morgan, were in attendance together with three members of the public.

Public Forum

One member of the public updated the Council on the issue of the VAS equipment for The Street. The part received appears to be faulty, so agreement was made to return and meet the postal costs required. Being new to the village, a representative from 'Parish Asset Management' introduced the Company. A third resident offered regular grass cutting of the OSPF in exchange for a donation provided to the Green Redgrave Group which the Council agreed to.

County and District Councillor's Report

Jessica Fleming provided highlights of her report:

Her Final District Council meeting saw the new planning enforcement policy passed which was welcomed by the Council and the public.

Essex to Norfolk Pylons National Grid have stated it would not be possible to build offshore given the 2030 deadline passed by the then Prime Minister, it has recognised the route following the west side of Diss is far more devastating than originally considered.

Thanks, from Parish Council were given for Jessica's department's assistance in funding for the upcoming Coronation event in Redgrave (7th May 2023) on The Knoll.

OSPF Safety The Council sought support from Cllr Fleming regarding costs that may be incurred to meet safety requirements, namely road signage. Cllr Fleming confirmed she was in favour of the measures.

Planning

Two planning updates were provided to the Council: DC/23/01562 – The Old Forge, The Street, Redgrave. Fell 1no Cedar Tree.

DC/23/01040 - Juniper Cottage, The Street, Redgrave. Fell 1no Eucalyptus Tree.

Both were approved by the Council, noting a cherry tree would be planted as a replacement for the cedar tree.

Ongoing Items:

Phase 2 and 3 of the Children's Playground and Village Hall Projects: Further conversations have been had with various landowners; options are being pursued. Continued updates will be given.

St Botolph's CEVCP School Decarbonisation Project: Botesdale Parish Council approached the Council to contribute to the project jointly with Rickinghall Parish Council. It was agreed to grant a proportionate amount (in relation to the number of children attending St Botolph's living in Redgrave). This would utilise some of the funds from CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) monies due to be received from the housing development.

OSPF Safety Inspection

A meeting was held between Suffolk Highways (SH), Police representation, a resident, and the PC. A Safety Inspection suggested the introduction of a 20mph speed restriction along the road; this was not agreed by SH and the Police although 'on road' signage and signs were agreed to be possibly acceptable.

Tube Traffic Survey

The results showed a considerable level of high-speed vehicles; however, the report suggests the number of HGVs travelling through the village is 'acceptable' for a B road. The Council will approach the Police to perform enforcement checks.

It was a relatively short meeting, but fellow residents may wish to note:

Community Woodland

At last our sites are turning green and we have had some rain and warm sunshine. Spring has arrived!

In Low Meadow, one of the big willow trees has been pollarded and lot of wood is neatly stacked in piles according to size. Pollarding these big trees allows more light into the meadow, which should be good for the other plants there. Our plan is to get the cut wood shredded and moved to Northfield Wood for mulching young trees there.

If people want wood stakes or bean poles for their gardens or allotments, please help yourselves. If you miss it this year, be ready next year! Unfortunately, willow does not make good firewood as it is so damp, even after the usual seasoning time.

The apple trees in Northfield Wood had blossom and should bear fruit later in the year. These are trees for the community, so do try them; as is customary with freebies, leave some for other people. There are also medlar and quince trees, one each. The medlars should not be picked until they are brown and soft, what we might term over-ripe.

The path through Miller's Orchard is quite grassy, which is something new. Now that a lot of dead wood has been cut down, it is not so sheltered and vehicles on the by pass can be heard plainly, but this should fade when the trees are in full leaf.

We are so lucky to have these green spaces and more. It is gratifying for us to see people enjoying them

Notes from the Green Redgrave Group

We held our first Annual General Meeting in April. Just over a year old, we have much to celebrate. addition to the more than 4,000 trees planted in the Old Allotments and the Old School Playing Field, we planted another seventy along a depleted treeline on our local farmer's land to try to create a dense wildlife More ornamental trees have also been corridor. planted; a Mountain Ash for the Queen's Jubilee on the Knoll plus 2 Silver Birches and one Crab Apple tree (John Downie) in the wildlife friendly garden surrounding our new children's playground. And we have another 900 trees already waiting to be planted next autumn. We planted 1,000 snowdrops and 300 daffodils on The Knoll, installed 12 bat boxes and 21 swift boxes around the village, sown a patch of ground with seed designed to feed turtle doves, put in place a regular litter picking programme and taken over responsibility for footpaths in and around the village. We have also put in place a series of wildlife talks, a bat walk and talk and one excursion to the Snettisham Spectacular, an amazing sight featured on the recent

David Attenborough's 'Wild Isles' series on TV. We have also 6 hedgehog boxes around the village and released three hedgehogs from a local rescue, the latest 2 been released in the last few weeks. And importantly we have formed relationships with like-minded groups such as the newly formed Green Hinderclay Group, the longeffective established and highly Little Headwaters Project, Green Ixworth and Green Risby and others. The hope is to form a co-operating cluster of such groups.

And the first swallows are back. A pair were found nesting in the village. Chiff Chaffs are also singing throughout the village in numbers. And butterflies and bees are starting to be seen regularly. We also had frog spawn in our village pond. Abd the swifts will be back soon; their screaming is a sure sign that summer is around the corner. The world is not so bad!

Our wildflower patch around the new children's playground in the Redgrave Old School Playing Field is progressing and we sowed the first seed in April. Hopefully this will become haven for wild creatures as well as for our young children.

Rather than a talk in April (at our AGM) we had a showing of a film called a 'A Surge of Memories'. This film, recently released by community groups and schools for educational use only, covers the recollections of the great flood in 1953 and also the floods in 2013.

We finally made it to the Snettisham Spectacular in March and were rewarded with a beautiful morning and a great view of the display by the wading birds. On Friday 5 May 23 we are planning a visit to the Jubilee Wood in Kenninghall (Hemp Meadow Wood). This wood was bought in 2002 and created the following year by residents of Kenninghall. It is an inspiring place which shows what can be done for wildlife and nature if a village is determined to do it.

Also in May we will, instead of our usual monthly meeting, be holding a workshop on the surveying of hedgerows. mature and veteran trees and the vegetation in the village. We may well also have a bat detection walk at the same time. More details to follow. This survey work, to cover also surveys of birds, insects and bats, is important to let us understand if the work we are doing is improving biodiversity in the village; that is, after all, much of the point of a Wildlife Friendly Village. We hope to engage as many people as we can in this work including children where possible. All volunteers extremely welcome!

We are still looking for enthusiastic volunteers to help us progress our activities. If you want to contribute or just learn about wildlife friendly activities then please join us. Stories behind the Stones – inscriptions on gravestones by Janette Robinson

The speaker at the March meeting of The Heritage Circle was Janette Robinson. Her subject was Stories behind the Stones, Gravestone Inscriptions.

Her talk began with the history of burial grounds and gravestones, some of which go back to 2000BC in the UK. Sometimes the gravestones surrounded the church, others had areas for different members of the community. The well-to-do lined the path to the church; the most important place being near the church door. Other parts were for village people, paupers and those who had committed suicide. The nobility and very wealthy people were buried in the church.

Bodies were buried with their heads to the east to see the rising sun. Headstones were usually made from local stone, but some were just wooden crosses. The term headstone has Jewish origins when it is customary to place a stone on the grave. The tradition of carved headstones dates from Victorian times. They usually gave their name, age, and often occupation and their place in the community. Janette gave examples of many grave stones she has seen in her travels, some of which had amusing inscriptions, for example 'I told them I was sick.' and 'Here lies an atheist. All dressed up and no place to go.'

The next meeting of the Heritage Circle will be on Wednesday 24 May at Rickinghall Village Hall when Graeme Simmonds will give a talk entitled *History Beneath Your Feet: Metal detecting, finds and more.* New members and visitors are welcome. Nyall's Notes LOHP Local News

CS Lewis is supposed to have walked into a meeting at a Christian conference and joined a group and asked, "What are you talking about?

He received the answer, "What is it about Christianity that makes it different from any other religion?"

He replied, "That's easy. It is grace."

Let's define grace before we go any further. A dictionary definition is that grace as presented within Christianity is that attribute of God through which he exhibits his free and unmerited favour as manifested in his forgiveness of sinners and the bestowal of blessings.

God has created a universe of two trillion galaxies each consisting of around one hundred billion stars out of nothing. Science tells us it began with the big bang and I believe that accords with the Bible but others won't necessarily agree with me. It doesn't matter. The point is that God created it and thus he had no need of human wisdom or endeavour. If we think that by some means or other we can do something to persuade him to forgive us we are on a bit of a loser. There is nothing that is big enough to influence him in the slightest. If there is a route to forgiveness it has to be free and unmerited, that is by grace.

There is one thing about free forgiveness that does involve us and that is that it has to be received. You can't be neutral, you can receive it or reject it and to receive it you have to be convinced that it is available. You receive it by faith.

If you offend a friend he may forgive you. Unless he tells you, you know nothing about it and know nothing of his forgiveness. If he says, "I forgive you," you may have one of a number of reactions:

- 1)I haven't done anything wrong if you say that you do not receive forgiveness.
- 2) I don't believe you again you don't receive forgiveness and will always think he holds a grudge against you.
- 3) I haven't put it right surely I need to reimburse you in some way.
- 4) Thank you, I don't deserve it but thank you very much.

Which of these attitudes receives, with the emphasis on receives as in making it your own, forgiveness? Receiving forgiveness affects you, you need to know that you have done wrong and you need to believe your friend has truly offered forgiveness.

How might you know? If you can't pay your way out and your friend steps in and pays the bill himself without expecting anything in return, then you know you are forgiven. All that is left is to receive it with gratitude. That is what Jesus Christ has done. The cross of Jesus Christ speaks, 'I have paid for what you have done wrong so that you might be forgiven. Will you believe it and accept it through faith with gratitude?'

That is what Christianity has that sets it apart from all other religions. That's grace.

Conservation & Community

May at last! Our sites will have awoken from their winter sleep and the different greens of the trees always look so vibrant at this time of year.

The swallows, swifts and house martins will have arrived from Africa, along with black caps and chiffchaffs and we will be hearing cuckoos in the Little Ouse valley. Red kites are becoming more usual over our patch and a pair of cranes were spotted on Blo Norton fen in early April.

As the oak trees start to flower, they provide food for 'looper' caterpillars (so called because they loop their bodies as they move along). These caterpillars are the favourite food of fledged blue tits whose parents have tried to produce their young to coincide with this 'harvest'.

Bee orchids will be appearing on Reeves
Meadows; marsh lousewort and marsh orchids
started to appear on the restored New Fen last
year and we are hopeful that they will be more
abundant this year. The orchids on adjoining
Middle Fen (SWT) will be really getting going
now. Do try to visit - they are spectacular!

Sheep's sorrel will be in evidence on heathland at The Frith, Hinderclay Fen and Broomscot Common.

Damselflies and Dragonflies will be emerging in ponds and other waterbodies across the LOHP sites.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Last month I extolled the virtues of home made compost and promised some simple tips to creating that crumbly dark organic material. You can make your own compost for free in as little as six months by recycling your waste organic material produced in the kitchen and the garden via a compost heap or bin. Getting the balance right is of course crucial - ideally 20-50 percent green leafy material and the rest more fibrous and woody. The key is to try and prevent your compost heap being dominated by one ingredient.

Use vegetable peelings, tea leaves, some tea bags (check details on the packaging to see if they are compostable), coffee grounds and that abundant supply of grass cuttings. Naturally, garden green waste but avoid adding items such as ripe weed seed heads or bindweed roots to the mix. Results of pruning are another good ingredient as long as they are chopped up small. Don't forget shredded newspaper and cardboard. Make sure everything is well mixed and turned regularly as decomposition doesn't happen evenly within the heap and this will speed up the rotting down process.

Whatever type of bin or heap you use, it will need to be covered to keep in the heat and limit the rain so as to avoid ending up with a slimy evil smelling mess. Compost bins are available to buy in a range of designs from the wooden kit versions to the plastic dustbin type one such as the black 'Dalek' style or alternatively make your own container using chicken wire and some stout stakes. Just a pile of compost in the open takes for ever to rot down.

I have found it is it is easiest to have two compost bins; one that you are actively filling and one where the compost is maturing and ready to use when required.

Plant identification now made easy

What would have been the stuff of science fiction only a few years ago is now available to gardeners. Thanks to artificial intelligence and machine learning, you can now take a picture of a plant s on your smartphone and receive an instant suggestion as to what it is and as an added bonus it will offer information about it along with advice about caring for it – amazingly often for free!

This is a breakthrough that offers levels of plant identification to amateur gardeners in a way that has never been seen before.

Getting the app is simple. Just go to the App store or Google Play on your phone and search for plant identification apps. Download and open the app and you are good to go.



Exploring the Past

Visit to Redgrave in 1993 of future King Charles Ill

His Royal Highness King Charles Ill will be crowned in Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6th May 2023 and the following day the villagers of Redgrave will be celebrating with an event on The Knoll in front of The Cross Keys.

Some of the parents of the children who will celebrate, and maybe their grandparents, may have been the school children who excitedly waved their home-made flags in July 1993 to welcome the Prince of Wales, Prince Charles, when he arrived at St Mary the Virgin Church. He had arrived by helicopter and landed at Redgrave Park. His Royal Highness was introduced to the owners of the park, Guy and Ann Topham. He then proceeded to the church in a green Rolls Royce car. The schoolchildren had walked from Redgrave School to Redgrave Church. At this time the primary school for children of Redgrave and Botesdale was situated in Redgrave, and St Mary's Church had just begun a £40,000 appeal for the restoration of the church. The Prince of Wales was patron of Music in Country Churches, a charitable trust, to raise money for the most beautiful and interesting rural churches, by holding concerts in them. A Malaysian Princes, Zarina Zainal of Selangor, also attended the concert, as she sponsored the two concerts held in Redgrave Church that weekend.

On the arrival of the Prince of Wales at the church. he was presented with posies of flowers by Emily Eason aged four, who was the youngest pupil at the school and Lauren Gwynn, aged eleven, who was the eldest pupil. He was also presented with two school T shirts for Princes William and Harry. Prince Charles said "the two boys would be thrilled with their presents". The school T shirts had photos of the Great Raft Spider on them. He asked the children to point out their teachers and said "How do they manage to cope with you lot?". He also stopped to speak to Beatrice Prossor who was on crutches as she had damaged her kneecap whilst practising for the school sports day. He joked with her that he hoped the doctor had fixed her leg the right way round. He also noticed and grinned at Kirsty Bond, aged 10, who had picked a posy of wildflowers. He commented that he liked the countryside and mentioned a new booklet produced by Redgrave History Group to mark his visit.


Nigel Rhodes, the headmaster, said about two thirds of the 50 children who attended the school, were there to greet Prince Charles.

The fourteenth century church was built by the Abbot of Bury, on the site of a Saxon Church mentioned in the Domesday Book. The church was beautifully decorated by local flower arrangers.

During the interval Prince Charles was escorted by Rev Ken Holder to meet other guests in a marquee set up in a field opposite the church, on land farmed by John Sharp of Hall Farm.

The music was played by the English Chamber Orchestra and included works by Mozart and Haydn. This concert was to launch an appeal for £40,000 for the restoration of St Mary's the Virgin Church, which was attended by over 450 people.

The prince would have seen the two horse chestnut trees on either side of the gates leading up the path to the church which had been planted for the Golden Jubilee of his great great great grandmother, Queen Victoria. These two trees had survived for well over a century but have since died and were replaced by two Mountain Ash trees for Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee and dedicated on Sunday 5th June 2022.

Another Horse Chestnut Tree had been planted on the Knoll for Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887 but this had not survived and was replaced by an oak tree in March 1894.





The Coronation

On Saturday 6th May King Charles and Queen Camilla will be crowned in Westminster Abbey. It is 70 years since Queen Elizabeth II was crowned there on a wet June day in 1953. 





The specification included in the contract document was very detailed but occasionally was not sufficiently thoughtful. A particular problem we discovered was in the section dealing with the curing of concrete, where the designer's insistence on the use of traditional water curing created a serious problem for following trades.

It started well; the concrete going up level by level, and the curing water draining down the building bucket full by bucket full.. No one took any notice of the puddles initially, but our electrical contractor was very unhappy to find his newly installed switch boards leaking dirty water from incoming conduits. Installation of the first fix electrics came to an abrupt halt whilst senior engineers from the JV and the electrical contractor sought a solution.

The problem was rapidly made more complicated when the contractors who were to install the plumbing and HVAC mobilised to site, not that the JV was particularly concerned as he was able to continue with the works for which he had contracted without any delays.

The designers were reluctant to change their specification but really didn't have an option, and a propriety brand of chemical coating was specified,

and the work site rapidly dried out and progress improved.

XXXX

A new activity commenced!!

The installation of the steelwork designed to make the concrete structure of the tower earthquake resilient. On each side of the concrete tower construction was a braced arch that spanned from anchorages at ground level to anchorages near the top of the tower. The bracing consisting of three diagonal and three nearly 'horizontal' members. At the landward end of the building, and spanning across the void between the ends of the two accommodation wings, the JV had to install three horizontal members with cross bracing. I will only describe the installation on one side of the building as the other side will be identical and simply lag by some days.

The JV took delivery of the large steel fabrication that would provide the link between the concrete structure and the external skeleton on one side, and inserted it into the recess left for it in the ground floor slab. The reinforcement was fixed and the void filled with concrete and carefully water cured in accordance with the original specification.





SCAM ALERTS

'DODGY' GREEN ENERGY INSPECTIONS

Trading Standards have issued an alert to residents with solar panels on their property to watch out for telephone cold callers who are targeting homes with solar panels.

The callers are making a number of claims regarding existing systems claiming checks are required to ensure the system is working safely.

They also falsely state that a voltage regulator is now required and if not installed, there is a risk the system will explode and set your property on fire.

The cold callers will pressurise you to arrange an appointment for their 'inspector' to provide a free health check and assess your installation.

Always be very wary of approaches made by telephone cold calls and never agree to have a so called free health checks and servicing, or have anyone visit your home, if approached in this manner

Solar panel owners should always talk to their supplier before allowing any work or so called maintenance to take place on their panels.

Generally, solar panel systems do not require servicing, apart from being cleaned if the panels have become dirty.

citizens advice Mid Suffolk

I recently started a new job where my boss has told me I'll have to work on bank holidays. This was never the case in my old job. Can my employer make Mid Suffolk me work on a public holiday, and should I get paid extra if I do?

When it comes to bank holidays, whether or not staff have to work is up to their employer, and you don't have to be paid more if you do. Unless your contract says you'll be paid extra for working bank holidays, you will just be paid your normal amount.

The situation will vary from job to job and may depend on a number of factors such as whether your place of work is

open on bank holidays, your hours of work and crucially, what your contract says.

Take a look at your contract, if you have one, to find out what your personal situation is. Your contract might say you will always get bank holidays off but it could say you are sometimes required to work or will always be required to

work. If your place of work is normally open on a bank holiday you'll probably be asked to work at least some. Your contract might say something like: "In addition to bank and public holidays, your annual entitlement to holidays is X days". This means you get public holidays off in addition to your annual leave entitlement but it might not mean you're entitled to take the specific days off. You may be required to work a bank holiday, in which case you should get another day off instead.

Alternatively, it might say something like: "Your annual holiday entitlement (inclusive of bank and public holidays) is X days" - this means you have to take bank holidays off as part of your annual leave entitlement. Bank holidays will either be deducted from your annual leave allowance (so you'll have to book all bank holidays as paid time off) or counted as additional holiday days.

If you don't have a contract, the legal default position is that your employer can tell you when you can or can't take time off.

If you find you need to resolve an issue with your employer, first ask for an informal chat, where you can raise your concerns. If this doesn't get you anywhere, you may need to raise a formal grievance. If you need advice on this, Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can help.


